Introduction

Ragpickers Education & Development Scheme (REDS) is working for the socio-economic development of ragpickers, coal-pickers, domestic helpers, child labourers, neglected children of daily labourers and migrated families of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes in Bengaluru, Ranchi, Hosur and Patna, who are in need of help to sustain and to use available resources properly by collaborating actively for their prosperity. Marianist Trust encourages and supports various activities of the REDS program.

Vision

Penetrate the world of the underprivileged, especially those children involved in waste recycling in the cities of Bengaluru, Hosur, Ranchi and Patna. REDS seeks to enlighten them with an intervention process aimed at holistic development, ensuring successful integration and participation in the mainstream of society.

Approach

REDS-Bengaluru has two main interventions through which it actualizes its objectives.

1. Prevention (Slum based)

Play Schools : Preschool education, health care, mother & child care, nutrition, care & protection for the child, support for schooling; moral guide once and training to prepare for livelihood.

Formal Education: Encouraging continuous primary education, sponsorship, hostel referrals, retention programs, health awareness, coaching classes, and family involvement.

Women's Empowerment: Self Help Groups, income generation-home based, supporting child's education, awareness of social issues & personal health, advocacy.

2. Reintegration

Street Presence : Area visits, counseling, rehabilitation, home visiting and advocacy.

Day Care Centers: Health & hygiene, nutrition, counseling, non-formal education, hostel referrals, child to child programs, awareness on social health & developmental issues.

Skill Training: Tailoring, computer technology, carpentry, welding, plumbing, electrical, non-formal education and job placements.

REDS BENGALURU

In its 39 years of existence, REDS-Bengaluru has been through different phases of development and streamlining. The initial welfare method, over the years, gave way to a developmental approach which eventually led to the empowerment of those we work with. Our understanding of the conditions in which the children live and the circumstances that lead to the choices they make have caused us to expand our boundaries both geographically and socially so as extend our support to children other than those involved in waste recycling. Now REDS has play schools, day care centers, study tuition centers, tailoring units, computer unit, and self-help groups.

There are the major objectives of REDS-Bengaluru.

REDS strives to accomplish its main objectives during 2017-2018 and the years to follow, by enriching children's learning experiences; bringing more school-dropouts into our program, providing evening study opportunities for our school going children. Additionally, we hope to provide young people with basic computer literacy and we plan to upgrade our tailoring units with power machines.

Street Presence:

There are numerous reasons for children living on the streets. Many children are lured by the prospects of a good job or to lead as independent life. Some are running away from a non-conducive environment and of constant bickering at home. Therefore, REDS extends its presence through various services such as counseling, hostel referral, food and medical assistance etc.

Day Care Center

The primary objective of Day Care Centers is to provide a space where children who are involved in ragpicking, can relax after their rounds. Further, the children are counseled and motivated to return to formal schooling. Parents of these children are involved in the centers so when the child does return to school, parents are capable of providing support. This year the day care centers focused on expanding sports programs by purchasing additional sports equipment, introducing audio/video programs providing field trips to museums, zoos, and historical places we provide a training programs four times a year for the staff. We created opportunities for dropouts to mingle with children in formal education or training programs. The three day care centers of REDS had 70 children enrolled.

Play Schools

Play Schools were initiated to provide alternative work opportunities for mothers in the areas where REDS works. These women are most often the sole earning members of the family with no one to look after the children in their absence. Play Schools exist to prevent children from going to the streets for ragpicking or from getting involved in antisocial activities. The schools facilitate the all-around development of 3-6 year olds who attend the day's activities. REDS-Bengaluru has 12 Play Schools in different locations of Bengaluru and Hosur.



There are 476 children admitted in all the play schools. The staff maintains attendance, syllabus, students profiles and conduct tests. Daily nutrition is provided to these children. Annual medical check-ups for all are offered freely by professional trainees. The staff also visits the families to observe the progress of the children and to introduce REDS programs. Periodical parents' meetings are held at the respective centers. At the end of the academic year, certificates are issued to facilitate joining regular schools nearby.

Tuition Centers

REDS-Bengaluru has five Tuition Centers. There are 199 school going students enrolled in these centers. Experienced staff help students to complete their homes work. Frequent tests are conducted to encourage the students to focus on studies. Children are taught various activity-based learning skills to improve the reading, writing, listening and speaking abilities. They are mainstreamed as per their performance. Daily nutrition and educational materials are provided for each student. Parents are involved so as to ensure the success of the child. REDS staff maintains regular follow ups to secure the child's progress.

Tailoring Units

REDS-Bengaluru has three tailoring units in Bengaluru, two in Hosur. There are 135 women attending these vocational skill training courses. Some of them are adolescents, dropouts and home-makers. As per the current syllabus, a professional staff trains them effectively. There are two batches per day. The program is held for 12 months: June to May. In the course of time, the program seeks to increase their economic self-sufficiency, social empowerment, and holistic development, eventually leading to their dynamic participation in all walks of life.

Graduation Day

This year's Tailoring Units with their exams finished, REDS-Bengaluru conducted a graduation and farewell ceremony for the trainees. After a welcome by Bro. A. Arokiadoss, SM, students were issued their certificates and marks cards by Ms. Catherine S. George and were congratulated by their instructors and staff. A cultural program of dancing and skits, performed by the girls, made for a joyful occasion. Snacks were provided. Many girls and young women expressed their gratitude to REDS-Bengaluru for their one-year experience. Because of the opportunity and training afforded them by REDS, they are now more confident in themselves, and able to work in nearby garments shops. To help them begin their work outside, REDS presented each girl with a set of tailoring tools. Gifts were distributed to the best students.

Computer Center

With the advancement of technology, computers have become an inevitable part of daily activities. REDS provides an opportunity to youth and children to become computer literate. REDS-Bengaluru conducts a computer literacy program in L.R. Nagar. Eleven individual computer systems are available with current applications. The syllabus includes basic computer, Microsoft Office, Tally ERP and internet skills. It is open to all but the majority are students of nearby schools and colleges. There are two batches scheduled every day. This is a short-term course held for a period of three months. After the successful completion of the course, certificates are distributed. Twenty-five children are presently undergoing the training process. This training widens career options for children and contributes to their integral development.

Self-Help Groups:

REDS-Bengaluru has 16 Self-Help Groups. The total 130 members each group is assisted by a coordinator who monitors all financial transactions, checks book-keeping and organizes meetings. REDS Self-Help Groups encourage women of the local slums to save their money. The coordinator motivates them to form new groups. Little by little, money is accumulated, saved and then taken as a loan by active members. Thus, the women become more self-reliant and empowered, able to pay school fees, hospital bills, or start small businesses. The SHG celebrated International Women's Day on 8th March 2018 at Infant Nilaya auditorium. The Chief Guest, Bro. A. Arokiadoss, SM inaugurated the program and Ms. Madhurani presented a brief account of the REDS SHG program. Sr. Celin, AMS, lead the gatherings and emphasized the importance of women's rights and savings. The day continued with cultural skits and songs performed by the SHG members. They highlighted the present conditions of the families and SHG's service in maintaining peace and harmony amongst themselves.

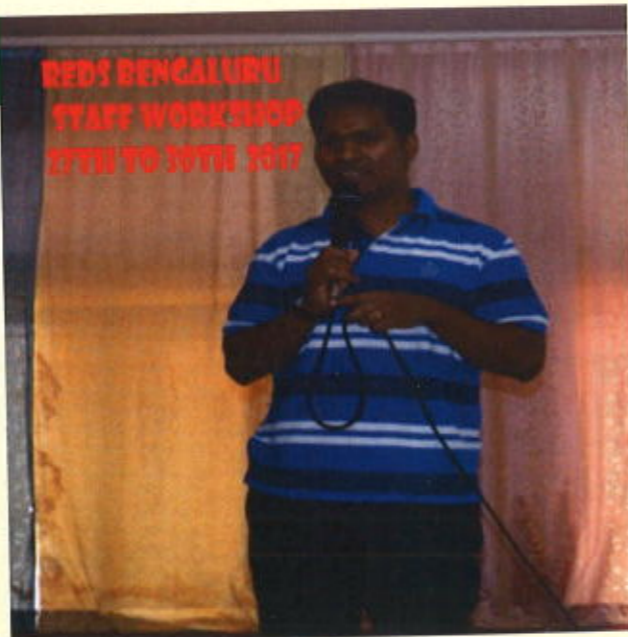


Pongal Celebration

REDS RANCHI

The Marianist Brothers have seen the plight of the rag pickers, who get up very early morning and go to the garbage pits, streets, temples, etc. collecting rags, coal, and begging for money or food; they come back home either with joy or sadness depending on how much they got for their living. Sometimes, they get nothing and as a result they have to eat food from the trash bins for survival. Such an unthinkable situation of the slum dwellers inspired the Marianist Brothers to work with and for them. It was the proper time for the Marianist brothers to tap up the challenge to meet this most difficult, yet most needed work for the neediest people of Ranchi they began under the inspiration of His eminence Telesphore Placidus Cardinal Toppo, and the guidance of their Marianists superiors. We, the Marianists, began with one REDS centre, and by the grace of God and the help of many generous people, today we have 12 centres where every day 1000 rag picking children attend classes. They are given food; non-formal and formal education; books and stationeries; school fees; uniforms, medicines, etc.



The brothers and REDS staffs are working with rag pickers and coal pickers in Ranchi city, the capital of Jharkhand. REDS stands for Rag pickers Education and Development Scheme. The sole aim of REDS is to educate and feed rag pickers, coal pickers, drug addicts, school dropouts and to work for the welfare of their families.



The prime goal of REDS is to work with the children of rag pickers, coal pickers, rickshaw pullers, day labourers, and domestic workers. These are the families who live in the slums and villages in the Ranchi city area. Their children are also forced to do the same work if they are not connected with the REDS programme or any other programme that takes care of poor children. The children of such poor families need a constant guidance, for the lack of guidance keeps them from breaking free of their parents' profession of collecting rags, coal and begging. Therefore, the Marianist Brothers, particularly, the brothers in charge of REDS make sure that the centre's-in-charges visit their houses to see the living condition of their families. In order to find out their living condition, a centre-in-charge interviews the parents and children, and finally tells them about the REDS and the value of education. After doing interviews, knowing the reality, the centre-in-charge makes a case file of a child and enrolls the child in the centre. In the centres, the children are given basic education – alphabets of Hindi and English, numbers, tables and basic mathematics. Besides these, they are also taught songs, stories, rhymes, and hygiene they are also taught basic moral behaviour to respect each other in the centre and outside the centre. They are kept in the centre for a year or two to prepare them intellectually, physically, psychologically and socially to go to a formal school.

REDS focuses on providing primary and secondary education to children and makes sure of their retention in school. It provides necessary educational materials such as text books; note books; stationery; school fees; school bags and uniforms to the REDS students to ensure compulsory education. Therefore, to make it happen, the centre-in-charge makes the students complete their home work, gives them tuition, encourages them and motivates them in their studies.

The centre-in-charge also conducts Bal Sabha (meeting for the students) explaining the virtues and values of life: discipline, honesty, commitment, cooperation, love, peace, Justice, patience, obedience, etc.

HOME VISITS



From time to time, the centre in-charges visits the children's families to explain to their parents the value of education and to encourage them to send their children regularly to a centre or school and to support the children in their studies. In course of a family visitation, the centre in-charges also talks with the parents about the value of supporting their children emotionally, psychologically and socially so the children develop their personalities properly well.

The parents share with the centre-in-charges their problems, difficulties and struggles of their daily lives. The centre in-charges listen patiently and attentively to them and encourages them to continue to be strong and to give support to the children to help them be successful.

PARENTS MEETING



REDS organises parents' meetings every month in each centre. The centre in-charge conducts the meeting with a different agenda each month. The REDS Director is also present at the meeting for it is one of the main ways of keeping up to date events of the schools. Thus the REDS staff can understand the families in a better way and offer them better service. It is also the time to encourage the parents and to make them aware of the value of life, of children, and of education. In the meeting, the Centre in-charge and parents discuss the child progress at school and to find solutions to academic and behavioural problems.

Mid-day Meal



REDS provides meals to the REDS children for both non-formal and formal students every day except Sundays. The nutrition includes rice, dal, potato, soya bean, vegetables, milk, and grams. On special occasions REDS provides eggs, chicken, and fruits. These nutritional foods give a boost to the children and protect them from malnutrition. The nutrition program is very helpful for the children as well as parents because most of the families hardly get two meals a day and then not full propositions. Therefore the nutrition program in courage the parents to send their children to REDS centres every day, and children love to come to the centres not only for food but also for education. Thus the REDS staff cares for the children, teaches them and prepares them for formal school.

MOTIVATIONAL WORKSHOP



- It was conducted for the students who were going to appear for matriculation in March 2018. The purpose of this seminar was to have a better performance in their exams. Twenty-eight students participated in the seminar, 17 girls and 11 boys. In this seminar they were told what not to do and what to be done and how to prepare for the examination. The students were told to avoid using electronic gadgets, TV, and media but to focus on self and group studies so as to understand the subjects and questions. The students were very positive towards the workshop.

This year (2018) twenty eight students appeared for the 10th Board examination. Out of which twenty six students passed, Fifteen of them passed in first division, eleven of them in second division and two failed.

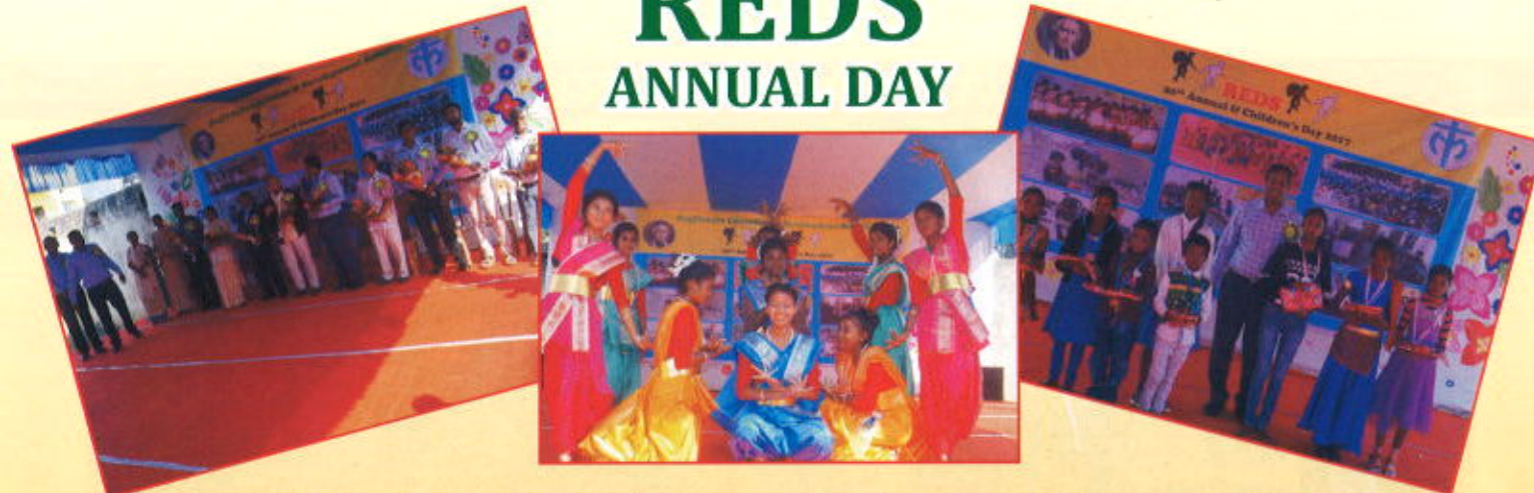

OFFSITE LITTLE CHAMP WORKSHOP

Date: - 23-09-2017 to 24-09-2017

Speakers -: Fr. JamesDungdung S.M and Mr. Nileshtirkey

Topics -: 1. What is time and why is it important?

2. Right to Education

Since REDS Children need continuous guidance and support, it was only kept for them which included class 1st to 6th standard students. The Program started with a welcome speech followed by indoor activities and cultural program to help the children to stay focused.

Time : Time is so precious for us because in course of time we grow in life. It is a valuable resource. Therefore, "Time is Money", said Benjamin Franklin. Fr. James, the speaker of the day said that time is a real phenomena and is a continuous process day and night, human life cycles, change of climate and seasons etc. But the questions that come to our mind are:- Is time real or fiction? Why it goes on? Where has it originated? Will it end any day?

In answer to these questions, first of all, time came into existence on its own. The origin of time has not yet been discovered. However, we generally know time in three Tenses:- the Present, the Past and the Future. Among them the Present is more important because it is available for us to use to develop our personality. Every second of the day is very-very important because it is like a wave of the sea that waits for no one. Once it is gone, it is gone for forever and what one should get in that present moment is also gone. Since time is the same for everybody, we should walk in the present time and make use of it well. If we don't, we will later regret. Fr. James closed by asking the students to respect and waste no time.

RIGHT TO EDUCATION:

Speaker - Mr. Nileshtirkey

Many people, especially slum dwellers, do not know they have a right to education and to the facilities the government gives to pursue education. The right to education is a human right for every child to be educated. The speaker, Mr. Nileshtirkey, gave more emphasis to the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act. Children are taught according to their standard in schools. The right to Education is an act of the parliament of India enacted on 4th Aug 2009, which describing the modalities of the importance of educating children between 6th to 14th years of age, under Article 21 A in Indian Constitutions. Mr. Nileshtirkey pointed out the importance of the family regarding education the family is the first school and the father and mother are the first teachers. Before going to formal school a child learns a lot of things in the family.





Mr. Nilesh named three stages of the education system and some of the facilities that each school provides for the students:- Primary School, Middle School and High School. At school, there are certain provisions and facilities for the students such as special classes for weaker students, mid-day meals, water, sanitation hygienic, library, playground, etc. He emphasized that education must be fearless and Friendly. Everyone is to study well and make his/her future bright.

OFFSITE YOUTH SEMINAR FOR THE STUDENTS OF CLASS 7TH TO 12TH

 Topic -: 1. Teenager at a Cross-Road
 2. Personality Development.

Youth Seminars or camp are very beneficial for the students. In the camp students learn to listen to one another; learn to relate on a level deeper than they do in the school or elsewhere; learn to respect the life of each other; learn to be responsible, and most importantly learn to know who they really are.

The topics presented to the students in two days of youth seminar were excellent in presenting the reality of teenagers' life and their responsibilities to develop a good personality. In this workshop 144 children from class 7th to 12th were present.

During the program, director Bro. Paulus honored Susanti Horo as best student of the year 2017. This year she got 83% in metric. Mr. Nilesh Turkey explained through films and games that they should light the fire of hope in their life and with strong zeal they should move on to achieve their goals. He also explained how to balance our mind and how to be stress free during the time of exams. Mr. Genius Bara then told the teenagers how to present their ideas in front of others. REDS director Bro. Paulus told the children that they are talented in other skills and they can also show the same talent in studies.

OFF SITE GUARDIANS WORKSHOPS:-

REDS organized a Guardian's workshop on 10th December 2017 for the children's parents of the twelve centres at which 442 parents participated. The resource persons were Mr. Ponchian Ker Ketta and Sr. Jema

The main Topics of the Guardians Workshops were:- 1. Importance of Perception attitude and thinking, and 2. Human Trafficking

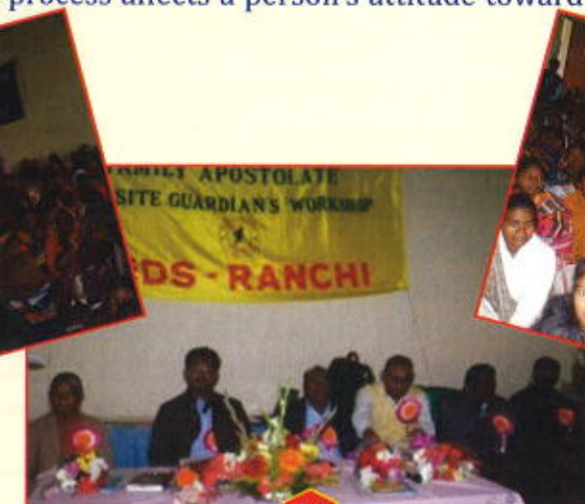


The workshop began with a thought provoking question:-

What is an attitude? Classify an attitude as a mental or neutral state of readiness, organized through experience, exerting a directive or dynamic influence on the individual's response to all objects and situations to which it is related. A simpler definition of attitude is a mindset or a tendency to act in a particular way due to both an individual's experience and temperament. Typically, when we refer to a person's attitudes, we are trying to explain his or her behaviour. Attitudes are a complex combination of things we tend to call personality, beliefs, values, behaviours, and motivations. As an example, we understand when someone says, "She has a positive attitude toward work" versus "She has a poor work attitude." When we speak of someone's attitude, we are referring to the person's emotions and behaviours. A person's attitude toward preventive medicine encompasses his or her point of view about the topic (e.g., thought); how he or she feels about this topic (e.g., emotion), as well as the actions (e.g., behaviours) he or she engages in as a result of attitude to preventing health problems. This is the tri-component model of attitudes. An attitude includes three components: an affect (a feeling), cognition (a thought or belief), and behaviour (an action). Attitudes help us define how we see situations, as well as define how we behave toward the situation or object. As illustrated in the model, attitudes include feelings, thoughts, and actions. Attitudes may simply be an enduring evaluation of a person or object other emotional reactions to objects and to people

(e.g., "I dislike bossy people" or "Jane makes me angry"). Attitudes also provide us with internal cognitions or beliefs and thoughts about people and objects (e.g., "Jane should work harder" or "Sam does not like working in this department"). Attitudes cause us to behave in a particular way toward an object or person (e.g., "I write clearly in patients' charts because it upsets me when I can't read someone else's handwriting"). Although the feeling and belief components of attitudes are internal to a person, we can view a person's attitude from his or her resulting behaviour.

How do you change someone's attitude? To change a person's attitude you need to address the cognitive and emotional components. How would you convince another person to start an exercise program when the individual may say, "I don't have enough time" or "I'm just too busy" or "I don't want to risk being injured"? One approach would be to challenge someone's behaviour by providing new information. As an example, explain to the other person how you made time in your day and, as a result, both your cholesterol level and blood pressure decreased. This is a cognitive approach when a person is presented with new information. Providing new information is one method for changing a person's attitude and therefore his or her behaviour. Attitude transformation takes time, effort, and determination, but it can be done. It is important not to expect to change a person's attitudes quickly. Attitudes are formed over a lifetime through an individual's socialization process. An individual's socialization process includes his or her formation of values and beliefs during childhood years, influenced not only by family, religion, and culture but also by socioeconomic factors. This socialization process affects a person's attitude toward work and his or her related behaviour.



HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Sr. Jema said that trafficking human persons is a serious crime and a grave violation of human rights. Every year, thousands of men, women and children fall into the hands of traffickers, in their own countries and abroad. Almost every country in the world is affected by trafficking, whether as a country of origin, transit or destination for victims. UNODC, as guardian of the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime (UNTOC) and the Protocols thereto, assists States in their efforts to implement the Protocol to prevent, suppress and punish trafficking in persons.



She explained that trafficking happens in restaurants, hotels, nail salons, airports shopping malls, etc. If you are to recognize victims, look out for these signs: Victims don't have the freedom to move and are closely watched. Excessive security in a workplace or home can signal captivity.

MEDICAL CAMPS

REDS organized medical camps for REDS children at twelve different centres at different periods of time. Dr. J.P Barla and Dr. Manoj Kora examined the children and distributed medicines as prescribed. It is perceived that this kind of health check up should be organized regularly in order to keep them children in good health. At other times the field staff provide medicine for colds and coughs, headache, fever or taking children to the hospital for treatment.



PRE-NATAL

Prenatal care, also known as antenatal care, is a type of preventive healthcare. Its goal is to provide regular check-ups that allow doctors or midwives to treat and prevent potential health problems throughout the course of the pregnancy and to promote healthy life styles that benefit both mother and child. A.N.M. nurses deal through counselling with pregnant women and gather information regarding the date of conceiving, which helping us to provide nutritional and medical assistance, A.N.M. nurses make suggestions to women regarding nutrition, t.t. Injections, iron capsules and the need for regular medical check-ups. A.N.M. nurses monitor and give prior support to mothers for their blood pressure and provide Horlicks and vitamins so that they can remain healthy and give birth to a healthy child. This is our effort to reduce the number of malnourished children in the slums.



POST-NATAL CARE

Care of both mother and child after delivery is very important. In the slums mother gives birth to a child with the help of local women rather than going to a hospital. The result is the mother and the child are both valuable. The mothers who are not healthy and able to feed their children properly, are given Horlicks along with grams and jagri to increase their blood count then they are able to recover soon and begin to look after their child and family. REDS efforts are reducing the number post birth death Amul milk is also given to children above three months to keep them healthy till six months. The concept behind this is a healthy mother equals a healthy child living a better life.



COUNSELLING



These days, with globalization society is changing rapidly. Individualism is creeping in to society and the concept of a joint family is rapidly vanishing. In nuclear families, members are less but they are not able to solve the difficulties arising in their day to day lives. It is, at this juncture, that we are very helpful to them. We spend enough time talking to and listening to them, which instills confidence in them. While taking they are able to acknowledge that they can face the difficulties. They are coming to terms with difficulties and are able

to love and live together, are able to sortout individual as well as family problems.

Individual and Family Counseling

Individual counselling is basically for the students who are school dropouts and alcoholics. Family counselling is very tough because all parents are not of the same nature. Understanding among the parents too is not the same for all who are not educated. Often times women do understand the need to solve the difficulties but their men do not cooperate. Thus lack of coordination among parents in running the family has a negative impact on the children. They do not get enough love, care and guidance. Counsellors of REDS are helping slum dwellers to overcome social and family problems and are re-strengthening parents' ideology of parenting.

VISITORS

August 2017 two visitors (Martha and Rebeca) from Spain and in June 2018 nine Students from University of Dayton (U.S.A.), visited REDS centres and came to know the reality of life of REDS children and their family members: the environment in which they live; the kind of food they eat; the status of their education; health and the kind of freedom they have in society. They were very sad to see the poor children and poor families, but they were happy to see the Marianists are taking care of them through the REDS programme.



VOLUNTEERS



On Thursdays brothers from St. Albert College come to the REDS centres; on Mondays Marianists sisters come to the centres, and on Wednesdays St. Joseph of Apparition sisters come to the centres volunteering to teach the children in our centres. Mostly, they teach the children rhymes, songs, games, and moral stories. The children are very eager to listen and learn from them. They also visit their homes and talk to their parents and motivate them to commit themselves to educate their children.

Self Help Group are one of the ways to get parents to organize themselves to run their families in a better way. REDS organises parents meetings, seminars and workshops for the parents to motivate them to be responsible for the betterment of the children and the in families. It is very gratifying that we are able to motivate the parents to save money for the future and for the education of their children. Many parents feel the need to be part of self-help groups. At present we have twenty self-help groups. Besides saving money some of them have began to look for alternative income for instance selling snacks, making pickles, driving autos and having poultry farms etc. These alternative works generate income and may bring change in their lives and families. At least they may be free a from rag picking and coal picking. REDS continues to encourage the groups to find alternative jobs; for saving money; for a better life and for a better education of their children.

REDS Children celebrated India's 71st Independence Day at all twelve centres. Chief guests were from the same slum area. On this special occasion, the children hoisted the national flag and sang the National Anthem with great zeal and enthusiasm. Bro. Paulus, REDS in-charge hoisted the national flag at Tokitoli centre and delivered a short message to the children based on the Freedom fighters and explained to them what the Tricolour and Ashok Chakra of our national flag portray. Bro. Dulare Lal sang a song for the children and read to them a poem that he wrote about our Freedom fighters.

Christmas gathering portrays the personification of divinity and symbolizes a very deeply significant truth of spiritual life. We are happy that we have forty nine students in the tailoring unit at present. Out of forty nine tailoring students six of them are from REDS.

Skill Training Center, DEEPAHALLI

Further development processes are possible only after the child is committed to residing in a shelter. Long term contact, which is essential to rehabilitation and reintegration, is made easier when the children are in a more stable environment.



REDS Skill training is an option for older boys who are not interested in regular schooling. Training is offered in Carpentry, Tailoring, Fabrication and the Electrical. Children from the areas we work in are sent to the Skill Training Center after series of counselling sessions and exposure visits to the unit. Only after the boy is sure about what he wants to do and makes a commitment of staying are also give non-formal education to help them with their reading, writing and arithmetic. Theoretical and practical classes are part of the training. . The Center focuses on providing skill training and formal education, focussing not only on the academic development of the child but also emphasises on the emotional, spiritual and physical development of the children for his successful reintegration into the mainstream of society.

Carpentry Unit

The carpentry Unit develops skills for making beautiful furniture. Through theory and practical work, the unit teacher guides the students throughout their studies at the Carpentry Unit.

On other days they stopped by any time. They brought their siblings, relatives, peers and friends. They came in small groups. They recreated, washed and had snacks. Always, they felt at home and happy to use the available opportunities.

Eight children are being helped to get formal education and special coaching, with their parents cooperation. In March, REDS initiated a pilot coaching cum drop-in-center at Maria Nilaya Campus, for child labourers, to test their regular attendance and participation. They responded well and look forward to coming. A few of their parents and guardians visited the office, expressed their hopes and grievances, and requested other assistance like jobs, loans, income generation opportunities the also requested us to tutor their children and to provide employable skill training to their grownups. They were informed that REDS Patna will continue the present activities for the children only, till until there are additional finances are available.

Therefore, the goal could be Resource Mobilization: by approaching likeminded individuals, institutions and agencies to provide regularly for the educational, skill development activities for a selected number of deserving beneficiaries, as visualized by the pioneers and being implemented in Bengaluru by the Marianist Trust since 1992.

The Marianists in Maria Nilaya, the staff and the trainees of Chaminade Training Institute, the neighbours, friends, youth and pious associations helped in many different ways to provide hospitality to the children.
