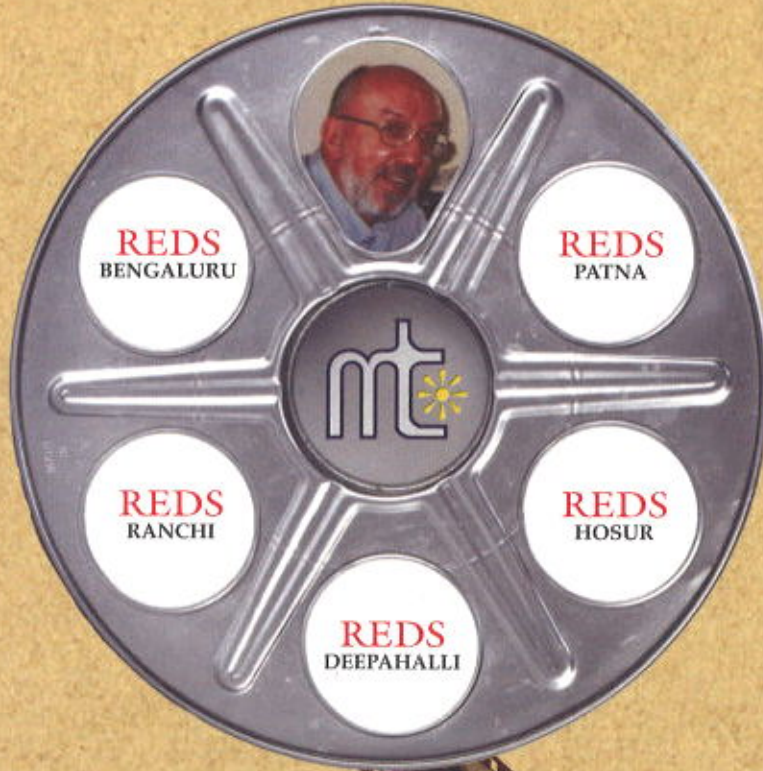

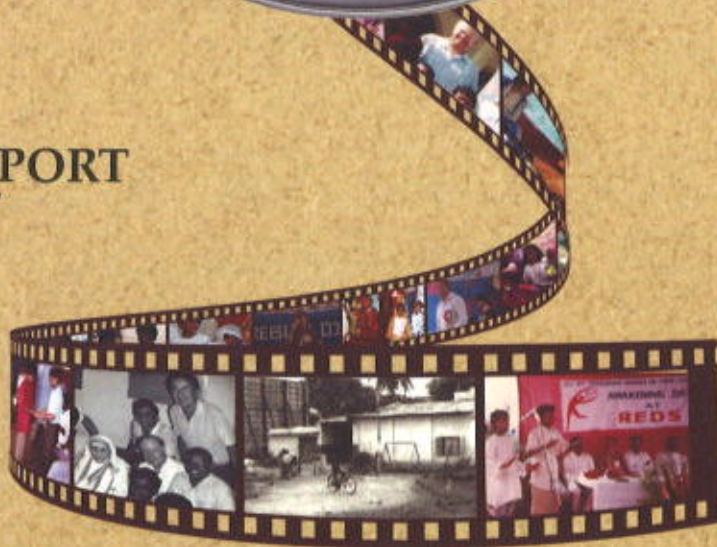

From the Executive Director's Desk!

Dear Friends and well wishers of REDS,

Seasonal Greetings! This year 2017, is the 25th anniversary for the Marianist Trust to extend its support to REDS. In 1992, the archdiocese of Bengaluru handed over the REDS Project to the Marianists, Society of Mary. Since then REDS has been actively involved in rehabilitating the underprivileged child laborers and their families through educational and vocational skill developmental programs. It is amazing to recall how God provides for the poor. As the time passed by, we also had branched out to few other places.

Whenever the past beneficiaries stop by, they express their gratitude with a big smile and compliment the pioneers and ask about them. And the newcomers wonder at the history. When looking back at the trials passed by, one gets energized to move forward adventurously. In this report REDS activities are presented as a kaleidoscopic image to thank the Marianist Trust.



Brother Richard E. Joyal, SM, the then Marianist Unit Co-coordinator, St Louis Province, US., was the Founder and the 1st Chief Functionary of the Marianist Trust, who envisioned its objectives with the pioneering Marianists and helped them to implement these objectives in Bengaluru, Ranchi and Patna. Trusting in Providence, the Brothers shared their skills and talents with the nearby institutions, extended hospitality to the deprived and reached out to those who had previously been unreachable in rural areas and also to those who lived in cities.

In March 1989, the Marianists decided to use their "Lenten Sacrifices" to feed the underprivileged children – the ragpickers and child laborers from REDS, a drop-in-Center of the BMSSS (Bangalore Multipurpose Social Service Society), which was located at the Sacred Heart Church Campus, on Richmond Road, Bengaluru. The Brothers invited them to their residence, washed their feet and fed them. The guests' cheerfulness inspired the Brothers. A few of them extended their service frequently as a part of their apostolic experience. The natives animated them. The beneficiaries and the implementers were pleased with the availability of the Brothers to care for the neglected children. In 1992, the BMSS handed over the project and the REDS Administration to the Marianists Trust.



Since then, the Marianist Trust has administered REDS and funds to rehabilitate the underprivileged child laborers and their dispossessed families through educational and vocational skill developmental programs. The International Marianist communities, associates, charitable institutions, friends and benefactors help the Marianist Trust to help REDS. The Trust also had organized several workshops and training programs for REDS staff and volunteers. These Marianists professionals and other experienced experts from the field educated them in Marianist pedagogy, in social justice and its relevance in India. They trained them to lead REDS and motivated them to give their best efforts. They listened to the staff's grievances, monitored their progress, and walked with them in the street and at times entertained them. They challenged everyone in the team to responsibly create a better tomorrow for the underprivileged. The Trust had received several invitations to implement REDS project where the Marianists were present and in other places. Several neighborhood institutions, pious associations and friends appreciated the Marianists and helped them to expand systematically in other places.



So, REDS Ranchi was inaugurated in 1997 and REDS STC Deepahalli in 1998. As per the REDS AR 1999-2000, 'the visionary who changed the face of REDS and assisted in its extension was Dr Brother Edward Violett, SM' who had succeeded Richard as the Chief Functionary of the Marianist Trust. Brother Ed had monitored the survey for REDS Ranchi in 1996 and REDS Patna in 2002. REDS STC staff was asked to extend their service to Hosur in 2005 to prevent interstate migration. On the 16th May 2017, REDS Patna Office was inaugurated at Maria Nilaya Campus.

Brother Richard and his successors had created an "on-the-job-assistance-program" for professional trainees and volunteers from diverse cultures and nationalities. The staff conducted orientation courses and accompanied them to observe in the field and to live with the beneficiaries. Those who have been involved actively, have changed their biases, prejudices and negative stereotypes. Some have initiated their own programs while a few have collaborated with us. REDS is networking with them and with others.





The Marianist Trust also encourages the eligible and interested Brothers and field staff to attend seminars to upgrade their skills and professional knowledge needed for their respective fields. The social entrepreneur's hidden touch too promotes life to the hopeless! The beneficiaries and staff are immensely grateful to the Marianist Trust and its partners for their gentle touch! All the best!

I take this opportunity to acknowledge and congratulate all the dedicated staff and the volunteers of REDS at Bangalore, Deepahalli, Ranchi and Patna who have contributed and rendered their service to the growth of REDS Beneficiaries since 1992.

I acknowledge with immense gratitude to benevolent contributions of The Marianist General Administration, The Marianist Provincial Administration, The Marianist District Administration, Fondazione Fratelli Domenticati Onlus, Missio Germany, Accion Marianista who have provided immeasurable support. Introduction to REDS

Ragpickers Education & Development Scheme (REDS) is working for the socio-economic development of ragpickers, coal-pickers, domestic-helpers, child-labourers, neglected children of daily labourers and migrated families (of Schedule Cast and Schedule Tribe) in Bengaluru (Karnataka), Ranchi (Jharkhand), Hosur (Tamil-Nadu) and Patna (Bihar), who are in need of help to sustain and would like to use the available resources properly by collaborating actively for their prosperity.



REDS's programs -street contacts, medical aid, literacy, recreational activities, formal education, vocational skill training, computer literacy, family visits, sensitization, income generation and financial assistance through self-help groups- had been formulated to eliminate ignorance, to prevent victimization and to promote holistic development for the needy children and their families in urban and rural areas. Seasonal and motivational camps are organized by networking with expertise and professionals to emphasize the educational development of children, to create self-employment opportunities for the teens and adults, to promote healthy motherhood and to educate on civic responsibility. REDS field-staff and the street-educators identify the beneficiaries, initiate a working relationship, discuss with the children's guardians and refer them to the REDS-contact centers.



The centers-in-charge and the professionals analyze their needs and respond favourably through the concerned authorities. The illiterate and the school drop-outs are tutored and assisted to enrol at the nearby formal schools. Their entire educational needs like school fee, uniform, text-books and stationeries are provided. To monitor their academic-progress continuously, these students are invited to the centers after the school-hours, for extra coaching and for nutrition.



REDS-staff maintain a working-relationship with the school authorities and continue to organize motivational camps for the beneficiaries and their guardians. A few of the former beneficiaries have joined the staff-team. Some of them assist during special programs and others introduce REDS to their friends and to the needy. We gladly share our resources with the beneficiaries. REDS office, REDS - Skill training programs- and the contact centers are located within the Marianist campus! Participants visit us cheerfully with their siblings, friends and relatives and with pets!

The REDS-STC (Skill Training Center) provides residential training programs for boys in carpentry, welding, tailoring, computer, plumbing and basic-electrical course besides educating them on mental health, healthy recreational activities, sports & games, personal hygiene, social-life skills, communication skills and value education. The eligible trainees appear for the SSLC exams. The primary school aged children are enrolled in the nearby formal school.

REDS Ranchi had introduced traditional knitting, creative embroidery and marketable soft-skill training. Different income generation activities are introduced to the trainees and to their families. They participate actively for their prosperity. In Patna, waste picking children, school dropouts, and their friends come to the Marianists' residence in Digha-ghat, on Saturdays' for recreational activities and for refreshments. The neighbours have joined hands to help these friendly visitors.



The well experienced REDS staff team and the support staff compassionately provide multiple opportunities to the underprivileged to live a dignified life through the kind resources of the Marianist Trust, benefactors, friends, institutions, agencies, companies, well wishers, associations and enthusiastic-volunteers from all walks of life! REDS also trains youth to create awareness among the public. REDS gladly welcomes the like minded to create a bright future for the disadvantaged. REDS Bengaluru

REDS Bengaluru staff team work together to implement all the programs, as in the past. They actively participate in the meetings, share their knowledge and experience. Their reports are being documented and up-to-date. During these meetings, the office highlights their birthdays. Special snacks are provided. All the staff get their remuneration through their respective Bank accounts. They gather at the L R Nagar Multipurpose center, pray to God to Bless their daily activities. The former beneficiaries of REDS are in contact with the staff. Most of the time they bring happiness.

We are happy to state that Ms. Saranya alias Sarvani has completed her degree. (BA - Bachelor in Journalism (JPS - Journalism, Political Science & Sociology)). Her parents are happy to see the first degree holder in the family. Saranya is grateful to REDS street educators and the staff for motivating her family. She offered this to her grandma. Her siblings and relatives continue their studies. REDS is thankful to all those who helped her. Many students are continuing their studies.



REDS Bengaluru organized 'Makkala Habba-2016' under the Theme of "CHILLI PILLI MELA" a get-to-gather for all the beneficiaries to gladden their hearts and to sensitize the importance of recreational activities which is their right. Total participants around eighteen hundred were from the families of migrated minorities, who live in L R Nagar, Rajendra Nagar, Ambedkar Nagar, D J Halli, Baglur Lay-out, Janatha Colony, Mysore Road outskirts urban of Bangalore and Parvathi Nagar and Ram Nagar in Hosur. On that day, the children displayed their various skills publically, otherwise who hide their gifts and talents.



These creative social activities helped them in their holistic development and remains as one of the memorable day. The chief guest's Shri. N.A.Haris, MLA, Shanthi Nagar Assembly Constituency, appreciated all the initiatives of REDS. As the chairman of the Women and Child Welfare department, he emphasized on the educational rights and motivated the parents to send their children to schools through the help of REDS.





Bro. Augustus Surin, S.M., the Chief Functionary of the Marianist Trust, introduced the developmental activities of REDS- Bengaluru. He appreciated the staff team, honoured few children and blessed them. Many well wishers at the venue were recognized. All the staff actively involved in fundraising for the event and executed the program. The Marianist Scholastics choreographed the trainees and their aspirants entertained. A few former officer bearers of REDS assisted the program.

Ascension Church Youth: The youth group from Ascension church conducted a musical programme "Mi Alma Canta" and donated to REDS for the under privileged children.

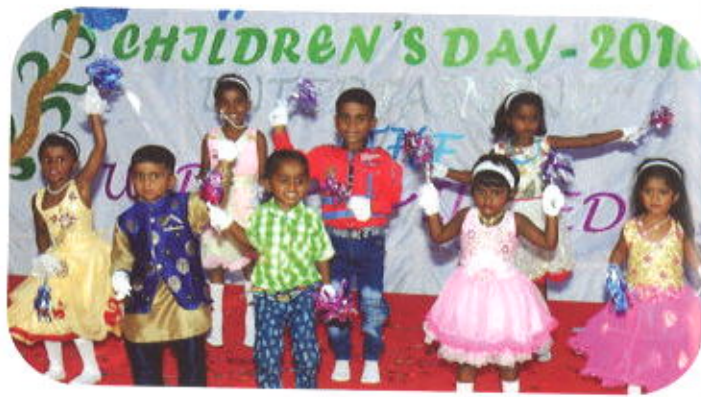

REDS Bengaluru organised a get-to-gather at Infant Nilaya to celebrate Pongal, the Thanksgiving festival of the Southerners. All the staff and few of their families, STC trainees from Deepahalli, neighbouring Marianists, friends, well wishers and visitors from UD participated. Father Bhaskar Gallelli, SM., blessed the gathering.



REDS Bengaluru has 16 Self-Help Groups. There are 120 members. The coordinator guides and monitors all the activities like financial transactions, book-keeping and organizes meetings periodically. The Raghavendra members had conducted an awareness programs at the Children's Day gathering. They dramatised specific problems related to illiteracy, domestic violence, finance and alcohol abuse and highlighted the remedial interventions of REDS. The SHG celebrated Women's Day on 8th March 2017 at the Infant Nilaya auditorium. Ms Jacqueline Jayapaul and Sr Teresa, AML., lead the gatherings and emphasised the importance of educational development of women to save the girls, their rights and duties to the society. The SHG had organized sports activities and fellowship meal. All the members received a memorandum.

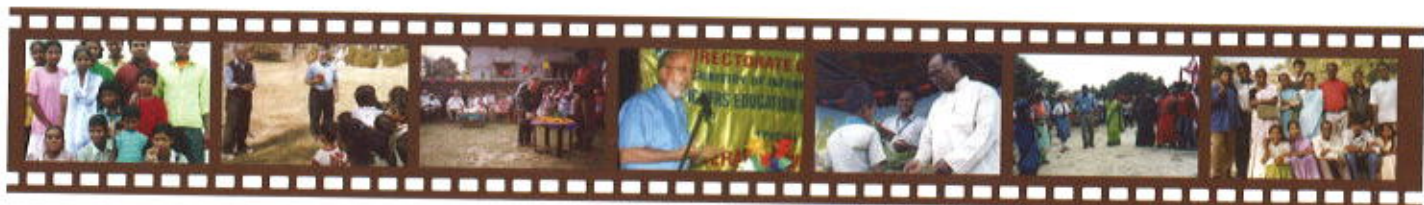

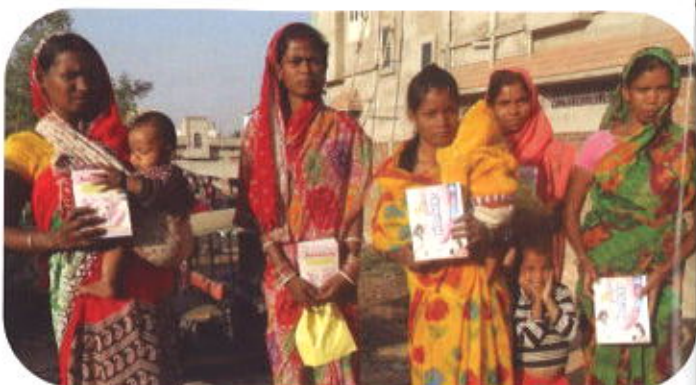

The REDS STC (Skill Training Center) provides residential training programs for boys in carpentry, welding, tailoring, traditional knitting, creative embroidery and marketable soft-skill training computer, plumbing and basic electrical course besides educating them on mental health, recreational activities, sports & games, personal hygiene, social life skills, communication skills and value education. The eligible trainees appear for the SSLC exams. The primary school aged children are enrolled in the nearby formal school. Different income generation activities are introduced to the trainees. Their active participation helps to increase their knowledge and to develop their practical skills. All help in campus maintenance and teach & learn from each other.



The morning assembly unites the trainees and the staff. The trainees read selected headlines from Kannada and Tamil news papers, take the unity pledge, and end with the National Anthem. Forty boys were present during this academic year; 12 of them are studying at the nearby Government School and the rest of them were enrolled in the training units; a few discontinued.

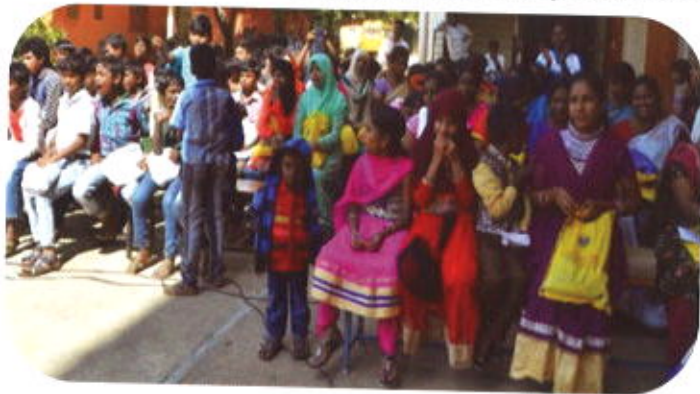

Office Inauguration:- REDS Patna continues to provide hospitality to the child waste pickers, their relatives and their friends on Saturdays. On Tuesday, 16 May 2017, Most Rev. William D'Souza, SJ., the Archbishop of Patna, inaugurated the REDS-Patna's Office cum Contact Center at the Maria Nilaya campus, Digha-Ghat. His grace blessed this ministry in the presence of our superiors, well-wishers, neighbors and the beneficiaries. The archbishop said that this ministry is for him "a dream project, very close to his heart" and has assured his support. The other dignitaries had narrated their associations with the poor and the needy in Patna, Ranchi and Bengaluru.



Father Santosh Tudu and the other Marianists looked after the maintenance works. Two outside rooms have been modified. The ground is cemented. Three bathrooms are ready, attached to an open washing area. The children use these specialties and recreate freely with their pets and friends. Their guardians cooperate. This is the continuation of the educational skill developmental ministry that was envisioned and executed for the benefit of the underprivileged by the pioneering Marianists -Brother Richard E. Joyal and his scholastics - in the 90's.

Children's Day Celebration:- In November, REDS Patna had organized a gathering for the underprivileged child laborers- the waste recyclers, domestic and office waste collectors at Maria Nilaya Campus, Digha-ghat. The Marianists and the volunteers - alumnae and aluminae of Chaminade Training Institute (CTI), with their relatives and friends-, entertained the participants. The committee had planned, shared the responsibilities and executed the program for the nearby ragpickers, recalling the noble saying of Saint Mother Teresa that "not to worry about numbers but to help one person at a time and always start with the nearest". Fifty-seven children had participated in the program. Though the organizing committee had informed them to come at 10:00 am, they started to enter the campus from 7.30 am onwards!
