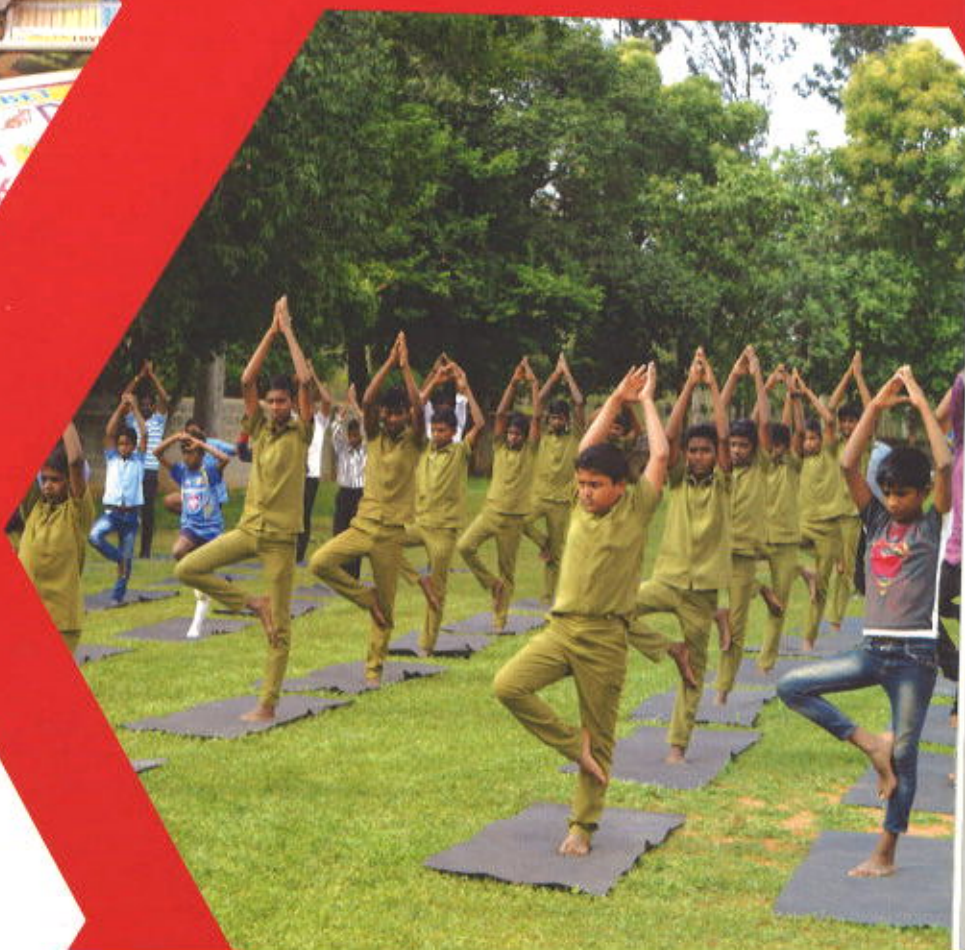

INTRODUCTION

REDS-Bangalore (Ragpickers Education and Development Scheme) is working for the socio-economic uplifting of the ragpickers, coal pickers, domestic helpers, child labourers, and neglected children of the daily labourers in Bangalore and Hosur. Its prime objective is to provide education for the downtrodden and underprivileged, and to improve their standard of living. Initiated by an inter-religious Dialogue Group in April 1979, this noble mission took shape in 1984 through the support of BMSSS (Bangalore Multi-Purpose Social Service Society). Since April 1992, the Marianist Trust, a registered Public Charitable Trust, sponsors and supports all the activities of REDS.

OUR APPROACH

1. Prevention (Slum Based)

Play Schools: Preschool education, health care, mother & child care, nutrition, care & protection for the child, support for schooling, moral guidance and training to prepare for livelihood.

Formal Education: Encouraging continuous primary education, sponsorship, hostel referrals, retention programs, health awareness, coaching classes to prevent them from becoming dropouts, and family involvement.

Women's Empowerment: Self-help groups, home-based income generation, awareness of social issues, personal health, and advocacy.

Self-Employment for Women: Tailoring courses towards self-employment, awareness of social issues, health awareness, and advocacy.

Computer Courses: Better employment opportunities, training to prepare for livelihood, personal health, and accompaniment.

2. Reintegration

Street Presence: In order to accomplish this, we do area visits, counseling, rehabilitation, home visits, and advocacy. There are numerous reasons why children live on the streets. Many children are lured by the prospects of a good job, or to lead an independent life. Some are running away from a non-conducive environment and constant bickering at home. Therefore, REDS extends its presence through various services in the slums, such as counseling, hostel referrals, food and medical assistance, etc.

SKILL TRAINING: TAILORING, COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY, AND JOB PLACEMENTS

Our Strategy

- Operates through integration, not in isolation.
- Involvement of appropriate stake-holders to participate in appraising the urban poor.
- Involvement of support for specific input, social engineering.
- Transparency by single-window accounting and auditing.
- Optimum utilization of existing resources, both men/women and materials.

OPERATIONAL GOALS

REDS-Bangalore organizes so as to make the best use of available management skills, technology, and resources. We strive to empower the poor and vulnerable to become contributing citizens of the global community by providing educational activities, skill training and self-help programs, thus enabling the disadvantaged, especially women and children, to live with dignity and purpose. REDS strives to help the poor use their human gifts so as to participate successfully in the mainstream of society. Thus REDS works for peace, justice, and holistic development of the marginalized.

In its 41 years of existence, REDS-Bangalore has been through different phases of development and streamlining. The initial welfare method, over the years, gave way to a developmental approach which eventually led to empowerment. Our understanding of the conditions in which the children live and the circumstances that lead to their choices, make us work hard to uplift them. This caused us to expand our boundaries, both geographically and socially, so as to extend our support to children other than those involved in waste recycling. Right now, REDS has 12 play schools, a day-care centre, 7 study tuition centres, 5 tailoring units, a computer unit, and 17 self-help groups (SHG) with 165 women.

PLAY SCHOOLS

Play schools were initiated to support working parents. Now REDS Bangalore has 12 play schools in different locations of Bangalore and Hosur. There are 503 children in play schools at present. The staff maintains attendance, syllabus, student profiles, and conduct tests to evaluate the students and improve their learning. Daily nutrition and annual medical check-ups are offered freely by the professional trainers. The staff also visits their families to observe the progress of the children and to introduce the REDS programs. Periodical exams and parents' meetings are held at the respective centers. At the end of the academic year, certificates are issued to facilitate joining regular schools nearby.

ACTIVITIES AT PLAYSCHOOLS:

- Educational play time.
- First aid and medication.
- Counseling, teaching good habits, etc.
- Home and area visits to motivate the parents to send children to school.
- Parent-Teacher Association held monthly to discuss academics.
- Picnics and educational tours organized twice a year.
- Exams and Parent-Teacher Meetings.



PLAY SCHOOL EXAMS AND GRADUATION



To evaluate the students and their knowledge, FA-1 Assessments from September 12-16 and FA-2 Assessments from December 17-20, 2019, were conducted. Subjects like English, Math, General Knowledge, Rhymes and Storytelling were held after a thorough revision. Most of the children gave their best in the exams.



FA-3 Assessments which were planned from April 7-15, 2020, and all the play school graduations which were scheduled from April 20-23, 2020, got cancelled due to Covid-19.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS

Because the centers are scattered in different slums like L.R. Nagar, Rajendra Nagar, Ambedkar Nagar, D.J.Halli, Mysur Road and Hosur, different dates and times between September 6-28, 2019, and February 3-25, 2020, were allotted for all the play schools. The meetings were conducted by Bro. Showrry Ravulapalli SM in the presence of the concerned class teachers. The parents were advised to send the kids clean and tidy to the centers. They were also asked to maintain punctuality and send their children regularly to school. They were asked to inculcate the habits of the city instead of the slum area. Valuable advice on how to bring up their children and how the relationship between a couple should be handled were discussed, since children often follow the example of their parents.

For the first time, this year, a large number of parents gathered for the parent-teacher meetings.





EDUCATION PICNIC FOR THE PLAY SCHOOLS

On March 14, 2020, a picnic was arranged for the play school students in Hosur of Parvathi Nagar and Ram Nagar. Nearly forty students, along with the teachers and cooks, visited the park. They saw different kinds of plants and trees, and enjoyed themselves in the play area. Vegetable bath with an egg, along with snacks, was distributed to all. They danced, played games and had lots of fun throughout the picnic with their friends and teachers. The other play school's picnic was planned for March 28, 2020, but had to be dropped due to the effect of Covid-19.

TUITION CENTERS

REDS-Bengaluru has seven tuition centers. There are 250 students enrolled in these centers. Experienced staff helps students to complete their homework and encourages them to focus on their studies. Apart from learning the notes given in the classrooms, tutors help the students become thorough in reading their textbooks, so that the students can be confident answering any question raised in the exams. Tutors encourage them to improve their writing and reading skills, and also try to improve their listening and speaking abilities. Parents are also involved to ensure the success of the child. The REDS staff maintains regular follow-ups to insure the child's progress. In addition to this, the staffs teach the students cleanliness and good habits; they also explain individual awareness for girls and health awareness in general to all. Tutors also involve the students in activities like crafts as well as general knowledge.

COMPUTER UNIT

Computers have become inevitable part of daily activities. REDS provides an opportunity to men, women and children to become computer literate. The computer syllabus includes Basic Computer, Microsoft Office Word, Power Point, Excel and internet skills. REDS introduced computer skills for slum girls, boys, married men and women who lack job opportunities. There are three classes scheduled every day, conducted in their own preferred languages. In addition to the planned curriculum, extracurricular activities such as painting and drawing will be taught to the students. This is a short-term course held for a period of four/six months, and after the successful completion of the course, exams are conducted and certificates will be issued to all. Twenty children are presently in the training process from which ten students have already graduated. This training widens career options for children and contributes for their integral development.

The reasons are as follows:

1. The children/adults in the slums get very few opportunities to enhance their computer knowledge.
2. Computer skills will give them job opportunities where they can acquire an even better education and improve their standard of living.
3. Computer skills provide them an ample opportunity to find a new job with a high salary and a bright future.

COMPUTER EXAMS AND GRADUATION DAY



The computer centre, which is located in L.R. Nagar, is being evaluated through exams. The students were informed in advance to prepare for the upcoming examination. Practical and written exams were held on February 19-21, 2020, between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm. The students were

trained by Mrs. Archana with regular practices in order to secure good marks.

The students worked hard and, with perseverance, Roboto Carles, Anitha and Rajalakshmi achieved 100% percent on their exams, which was admired by all. Fr. Sudhir Kujur SM, the Executive Director of REDS, and Mr. Jeevan Das Fernandes were the guests of honor for Graduation Day. They gave a thoughtful speech about the Marianist Brothers and their service to the lay people. They also suggested that when one has the ability to help others, let them help wholeheartedly, and the good deeds will come back in the form of a blessing.



All the students were thankful to the REDS organization and Bro. Showry Ravulapalli SM for giving them such a wonderful opportunity. Many cultural programs were held, medals were given for the highest marks holder, and certificates were distributed to all the graduates. As it was the last working day for them, joyful emotions were everywhere. Bro. Showry, the Director of REDS, appreciated the hard work of the teacher, congratulated the trainees for their efforts, and wished them all the very best in their future endeavors.

Students of the REDS Computer Centre shared their experiences, saying that "The computer class was very informative for learning new technological skills." They said that their teacher taught them even in the local languages in case they found difficulty understanding the subject. They thanked their teacher, Mrs. Archana, for her dedication and encouragement.

Mrs. Sandhya, one of the graduates, shared her experience by saying that, even though she is married, she attended the computer class and, with the support of her teacher, she secured a 99% mark. She said that she was able to give her best thanks to the continuous motivation given by the REDS staff and her teacher.

Along with the guests of honor, Fr. Prasad Nitta SM, Bro. Rayappan SM, and Fr. Joseph Raj SM were present to encourage the students.

TAILORING UNITS

REDS-Bengaluru has five tailoring units in Bengaluru and Hosur. There are 130 women attending these vocational skill-training courses. Some of them are adolescents, dropouts, and homemakers. As per the newly revised syllabus, the professional staff trains them effectively. There are two classes per day, one from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm and the second from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm. The program is held for eleven months, June to April. They learn embroidery, cutting, stitching of many kinds of dresses like Chudidhar, salwar, frocks, sari blouses, school uniforms, etc. Different kinds of handicrafts--like bag making, doormat making with the help of crochet wool, and saree kuchu making--are taught. In the course of time, the program seeks to increase the students' economic self-sufficiency, social empowerment, and holistic development leading to their dynamic participation in all walks of life. They can learn and earn at the same time too.

TAILORING EXAMS AND GRADUATION

Tailoring exams were held from February 12-15, 2020, and trainees gave their best in theory and practice. Unfortunately, the graduation ceremony planned for April 16 and the picnics planned for March 17, 18, and 28, 2020, for different centers had to be cancelled due to the Covid-19 lockdown.

DAY CARE CENTRE

The primary objective of the Day Care Center is to provide a space where children involved in rag-picking can relax after their rounds. We ensure that these children get an equal opportunity like others to become educated. They are counseled and motivated to return to formal schooling. The Day Care Center focus on sports programs, audio/video programs, etc. We create opportunities for dropouts to mingle with other children/students who are in formal education or training programs. Parents of these children are involved in the centers, so if the child does not return to school, their parents are capable of providing support. In addition to the basic syllabus, they will be taught English reading, basic math and indoor games like ludo, carom boards, snake and ladder, etc....

THE SHG PROGRAM (SELF-HELP GROUP)

The SHG (Self-Help Group) tries to organize parents for the betterment of their children and families. By conducting seminars and workshops, many parents begin to feel the need to join the Self-Help Groups. The program animator, Mrs. Madhurani, is very dedicated in her work with innovative ideas. REDS-Bengaluru has 17 Self-Help Groups, (with a new group introduced this year) with a total of 165 members. Most of them are homemakers, domestic servants, and illiterates; only a few can read either Tamil or kannada. They depend upon loan facilities in order to support their children's education, start a business, build a house, clear their debt to money lenders, or deal with any emergency health issues, etc. The animator encourages each individual to form different groups. Each group elects a leader who monitors all financial transactions, including bank book-keeping. Every member of the group takes a turn to chair the weekly meetings, where the members save money and receive loans. They all participate in the utility-building training programs. They elect a president, secretary, and treasurer (Representative One and Two) for each group. The animators assist them to open accounts in the nearest banks. A new group called Infant MSSS with 11 members was formed this year.



Purposes of loans taken by the Self-Help Group members are:

- To educate the children.
- To repair their existing houses.
- To construct new houses.
- To meet domestic expenditure/needs.
- To start petty business/self-employment opportunities.



- To meet medical expenses.
- To repay higher interest loans.
- To redeem mortgage items.
- To undertake pilgrimage tours.



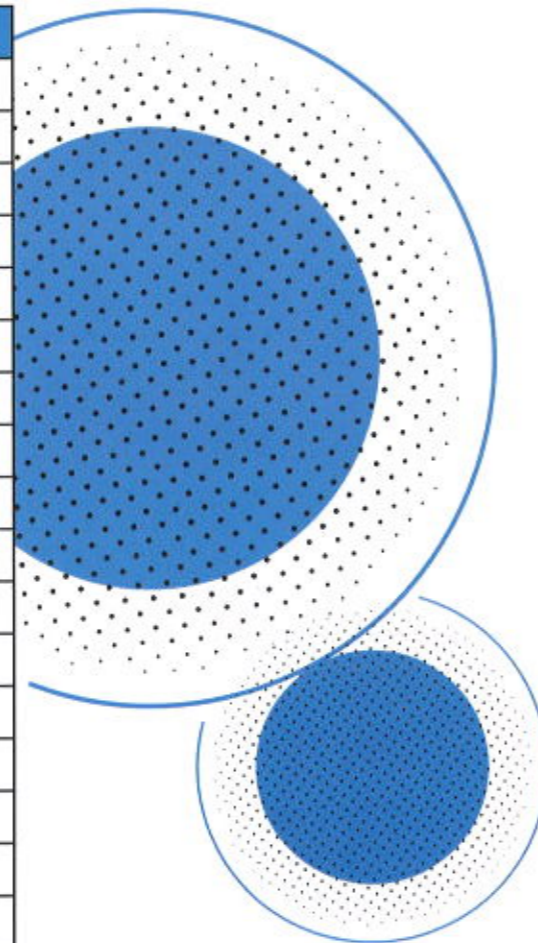
Impact of the Self-Help Groups in slums:

- The SHG members cultivate the habit of savings for their emergency needs.
- Helps them repay interest, thus avoiding exploitation by the money lenders.
- Exposure to bank formalities.
- Development of leadership qualities.
- Educates the women through an awareness program on different subjects.

REDS STAFF WORKSHOP

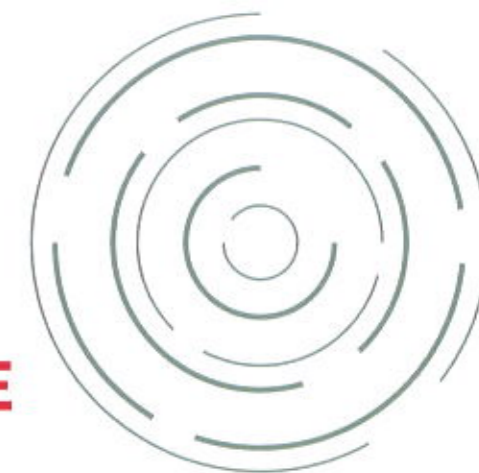


On February 2, 2020, a workshop was arranged to enrich and refresh the staff.

VOLUNTEERS FOR REDS

Since REDS is an organization working to uplift the poor and the needy, many colleges send their students to gain knowledge and information about their situation. The students who participate as volunteers are encouraged to pursue and build a deeper understanding of poverty issues by applying social work skills, principles, theories, and interventions. Four students of St. Aloysius Degree College, Bengaluru, and two students from St. Joseph College, Bengaluru, successfully completed their 24 days of field work at REDS from September 5 to December 6, 2019. One student from Ramaiah College, Bengaluru, worked for 12 days with us between December 20 and January 11, 2020. The volunteers who join REDS become part and parcel of the program and all the activities it conducts. They were very helpful during the Children's Day celebration and the classroom activities.

COVID-19 AWARENESS PROGRAM BY THE REDS STAFF IN THE SLUMS

As directed by the government, the Play Schools were shut so the teachers went door-to-door in areas like L.R.Nagar, Ambedkar Nagar, Rajendra Nagar, Mysur Road, D.J. Halli, Parvathi Nagar, and Ram Nagar of Hosur to create awareness about the Corona virus from March 15-21, 2020. Around 14 staff educated the students and parents of REDS and the local area to take precautionary measures like wearing masks, washing hands with soap regularly, maintaining social distance, and personal hygiene. We thank the staff for doing this noble work.



CASE PROFILES OF THE YEAR 2019-2020



I am Malathi, mother of my only daughter Dhanushri. I am also a single parent. My husband left me and re-married (his second), so I am staying in my mother's place with nobody to take care of me and my daughter. I started searching for a school for my daughter so that she would remain safe, and they referred me to the REDS Play School. REDS accepted, and I enrolled my child to REDS Play School Number 2. As my daughter is quiet mischievous, I was worried whether the REDS staff would take good care of my child, but my concerns were proved wrong. She was given good care in the class and became a good student with the advice of her teacher, Mrs. Gracy. Now she studies well, recites rhymes, and remembers by heart the words taught to her in the class. During the Corona lockdown, I received groceries from REDS which were very helpful. As my daughter is safe in the Play School, I am able to search for a job and earn a little income. Like other parents, I too started searching for a school, and I found REDS. They take good care of my daughter, teach well, and wait patiently even when I am late to pick up the child.

I was unable to pay the fees for my elder daughter Jayapradha, so I stopped her from attending regular school and made her join the REDS Computer Centre situated at L.R.Nagar. Now she has learned computer Basics. We are very thankful to REDS for helping both of my daughters.



My son is studying in the REDS Tuition Centre. All my family members are happy as there are all kinds of facilities at the REDS Tuition Centre. My son is also studying well because of his teacher Mrs. Rupa, who is teaching good discipline, good handwriting, and makes them to do their homework. REDS RANCHI

The Marianist Trust members have witnessed the plight of the rag pickers in slums who get up very early each morning to scavenge garbage pits, streets, and temples, collecting rags and coals, and begging for money or food. They return home either joyful or sad, depending upon what and how much they obtain each day. Sometimes they find nothing and are then forced to eat food from trash bins for survival. Such unthinkable situations inspired the Marianists to work and care for these piteous rag pickers. It seemed providential for us to accept the challenge to focus our apostolic efforts on the neediest people of Ranchi City. Under the inspiration of His eminence Telesphore Placidus Cardinal Toppo and the guidance of the Marianist superiors, we began with one REDS centre, but by the grace of God and the help of many generous people, today we have twelve centres in Tokitoli, Chutia, Bargawa, Hatma, Irgutoli, Pahari, Khadgarha, Argora, Hindpiri, Doranda, Mosibari, and Hatia. Children are fed and receive non-formal and formal education. Books, stationery, uniforms, medicines, and school fees are also covered. We are gratified to see the progress of these children and their families.

The Marianists and the REDS staff work with rag pickers and coal pickers in Ranchi City, the capital of Jharkhand. REDS is known as **Ragpickers Education and Development Scheme**. The sole aim of REDS is to educate and feed the rag pickers, coal pickers, drug addicts, and school dropouts, as well as to work for the welfare of their families.

NON-FORMAL EDUCATION

St. Mother Teresa says, "The fruit of love is service, which is compassion in action." The REDS staff renders their service with love towards poor children. They teach basic educational skills including studying the Hindu alphabet, English, numbers, tables, and basic mathematics. They are instructed in music, storytelling, hygiene, and basic moral behavior, focused upon respecting each other both inside and outside the centre. Children are divided into groups based upon their learning capacity in the REDS centres. To avoid student absences, the coordinator teachers have formed groups of three or four students. This method is helping students to attend regularly and participate in every activity together. They are kept in the centre for a year or two to prepare them intellectually, physically, psychologically, and socially to advance to a formal school.

Education enables us to know ourselves and the world better. It develops in us a perspective for looking at life. It is the key to one's success in the future and provides opportunities to shine in life. Education helps people think, feel, and behave in a way that contributes to their success and improves their personalities.

REDS continues to march with the lives of slum dwellers, especially the most needy and poorest of the poor families. REDS focuses upon the education of children by providing primary and secondary classes for children and making sure of their retention in school. Necessary educational materials are supplied, such as textbooks, notebooks, stationery, school fees, school bags, and uniforms to guarantee compulsory attendance. To make it happen, the centre coordinator expects the students to complete their homework while encouraging and motivating them in their studies besides compensating their tuition. The REDS staff has been rendering their service tirelessly for the uplifting of poor children so that their dreams may come true in the future.

HOME VISIT

Home visits help to establish strong and positive communication between a REDS staff and the parents of REDS children. The REDS staffs motivate them to send their children regularly to the centre and its school, and to encourage their children to focus on studies. One of the most important aspects of a home visit is to understand the lives of the children and the challenges that they face. During the visit, the centre coordinator talks to the parents about the children's personality development and the value of supporting them emotionally, psychologically, and socially. Parents often share the problems, difficulties, and struggles in their daily lives with the centre coordinator who listens patiently and attentively. The staff encourages them to continue to be strong and to support their children, helping them to become more successful in their lives.

PARENTS' MEETING

REDS organizes parents' meetings every month in each centre. The parents' and REDS staff meetings have proven effective because they enable parents to discuss issues like the values of life, of children, and of education. The centre coordinator conducts the meeting with varied agendas each month to discuss the children's progress. The parents' meeting helps both parents and the centre coordinator know more about children's concerns and weaknesses so that parents can play an active role in their children's education and find solutions to academic and behavioral problems. At the same time, these meetings provide an opportunity for the centre coordinator to discover new methods to assist the children to learn more effectively. During these meetings, the REDS director also builds a rapport with both parents and children, so as to know them better and guide them in the right direction.

MID-DAY MEAL



A mid-day meal is important for combating classroom hunger and promoting better learning. It is also effective in improving physical and psycho-social health for disadvantaged REDS children. REDS provides meals for both non-formal and formal students every day except Sundays. The menus include rice, dal, potato, soya bean, vegetables, milk, and grams. From time

to time on special occasions, REDS serves eggs, chicken, and fruits. These nutritional foods boost the children and protect them from malnutrition. Such meals are very important for providing nutrition to families that hardly obtain two substantial meals a day. The nutrition program motivates parents to send their children to REDS centres every day. Children love to come to the centres, not only for food but also for an education. In summary, the REDS staff takes care of the children while teaching and preparing them for formal school.

MOTIVATION SEMINAR FOR 10TH & 12TH STUDENTS

On January 26, 2020, REDS conducted a workshop for students who were going to write matriculation and intermediate final exams. Fr. James Dungdung, SM, gave a motivational talk to the students. Twenty-one Matriculation and sixteen Intermediate students were preparing to take the examination in February, 2020. The motivational seminar addressed these questions: What to do and what not to do? How to prepare for an examination? How to manage the time? The students sought some solution for avoiding the overuse of electronic devices like phones and TV. The students were very positive and impressed with the workshop. This year, thirty students successfully passed the 10th standard and the intermediate exams with flying colors. Every month REDS Ranchi organizes various motivational workshops and counseling sessions for its school children and their parents. All these workshops and the hard work of the REDS staff helps the children understand the value of a formal education. Congratulations to the REDS Ranchi staff and the children.

WORKSHOP FOR INTER AND METRIC PASS STUDENTS

On July 8, 2019, our REDS director invited all of the 10th and 12th class students to a workshop, where he appreciated their hard work, gave them a word of encouragement, and also some suggestions for their future. He recalled Swami Vivekananda's very popular statement "Get up, wake up, and don't stop till you reach the goal." Bro. Paulus Lakra encouraged the students by saying that even academic failures should not stop them from growing as a good person. People need to work hard until they reach their goal. After his speech, on behalf of the REDS Program, he gave a gift to the 10th class students as a token of love and appreciation. The workshop ended with lunch.

REDS STAFF WORKSHOP

On July 25-26, 2019, the Director of REDS organized a three-day workshop for the REDS staff. Fr. Telesphore Ekka was the resource person. Throughout his talk, he encouraged the staff that one can make a positive change in a society. He shared some of the effective tools that we can use in our social work. He further explained some of the new methods for reaching children and parents to bring about change in their lives.



SPORTS DAY

Games and sports make REDS children healthy, fit, active, fresh, and social. They teach children the value of discipline and provide the best exercise for the body. Sports foster a sense of community and help students achieve their personal best every time. Included are all forms of competitive physical activity and games which, through casual



or organized participation, aim to maintain or improve physical ability and skills while providing enjoyment to all participants. Sports also have beneficial uses and provide recreation, relaxation, teamwork and team spirit, physical health,

improvement of fitness, growth in cognitive function of the brain, and powerful decision-making which we want to see infused in the life of our REDS children. Regular sport activities make children active and lead to good health.



REDS ANNUAL DAY

REDS Ranchi does its best to serve the poor children in the Ranchi area through its various innovative programs. This year, REDS Ranchi began the 22nd anniversary of its foundation with great hope and enthusiasm to fulfill its founding mission. REDS Ranchi celebrated its foundation day at St. Francis School, Samlong, Ranchi, on November 24, 2019. Around 1,200 children participated, along with the Marianist Brothers from the Ranchi area. Fr. Sudhir Kujur and Bro. Bartholomio Kandulna were the chief guests at the event. The children from various REDS centres performed dances, dramas, and songs which included a wide variety of languages and costumes. The children and guests were given a grand lunch and the annual celebration ended with success and joy. Bro. Paulus Lakra, the director of Ranchi REDS, expressed happiness over the day's successful annual celebration and thanked the staff and the donors for making it a festive day for the children.

OFF-SITE LITTLE CHAMP WORKSHOP

THE SUMMER CAMPS TO REJUVENATE OUR REDS CHILDREN

Summer camps were held for both middle school children on April 27-28, 2019, and for the high school and intermediate students on May 4-5, 2019. The first middle school topic was entitled **The Importance of Education**. The speaker, Fr. James Dungdung, explained that learning is a lifelong process. The more we learn, the more we acquire knowledge, which shapes our personality into one that is more productive and effective. The second topic was **Be a Smart Student** presented by Mr. Nilesh Tirkey, who urged the students to learn from all the events of life. This particular topic opened the minds and hearts of the students to how many children are being abused on a daily basis, worldwide. The children were advised to be sensitive about inappropriate touching, and to be assertive, not afraid of reporting it to a concerned person if such a touch occurs.



OFF-SITE YOUTH SEMINAR

FOR THE STUDENTS OF CLASS 7TH TO 12TH

REDS Ranchi assists many poor children to continue their studies in various educational institutions in Ranchi. Every month REDS Ranchi organizes motivational workshops for the school-going children and their parents. These workshops have helped them awake from the slumber of illiteracy and poverty. On September 27-28, 2019, REDS Ranchi organized a workshop for the school-going children from 7th standard to 12th standard in Singhpur, Sarai Toli. The topic of the workshop was **What are you going to do after schooling?** On September 27, 2019, Fr. Telesphore Ekka was the motivational speaker at the workshop. He emphasized the importance of education and how it can help them overcome poverty and various social issues. On September 28, 2019, Mr. Nilesh Tirkey discussed worries about getting good grades and issues related to suicidal tendencies. One hundred and eighty children participated in the workshop. The children found it very useful and they thanked the REDS staff for organizing it.



ON-SITE GUARDIAN WORKSHOP



On August 10, 2019, Sister Stella Kispotta and Mr. Vinodkumar Thakur led a workshop for the parents of the REDS centres Tokitoli, Bargawa, and Chutia in Gyan Deep, Lowadi. Sister Stella Kispotta and Mr. Vinodkumar Thakur interacted with the parents and motivated them to become involved in their children's education. About sixty parents attended the workshop with great enthusiasm. Ranchi REDS aims at assisting both the parents and their children in the best ways to a healthier future.

OFF-SITE GUARDIANS WORKSHOPS

On December 15, 2019, REDS Ranchi organized a workshop for the parents of the REDS Ranchi children at Prabhat Tara School, Singhpur. This workshop presented the importance of employment opportunities, saving, and nutrition. Four hundred and six parents participated in the workshop, where Mr. Nelesh Tirkey and Fr. James Dungdung were the presenters.

On January 31, 2020, Bro. Paulus Lakra organized a special motivational workshop for the high school students. Twenty-one students participated in the workshop and they were grateful to REDS Ranchi.

On March 14, 2020, Bro. Paulus Lakra organized a workshop for parents from the centers of Tokitoli, Bargawa, and Chutia. Ninety-eight parents participated. Bro. Marianus Bilung and Mr. Rudhir Linda explained to the parents the importance of building a good family where a child can have happy experiences.

On March 16, 2020, REDS Ranchi organized a workshop in the Pahari Centre to teach the mothers the importance of literacy and basic education. About sixty-one mothers participated in this workshop, which convinced some of the parents to begin reading and writing. REDS Ranchi realizes the importance of empowering the parents of REDS children. For this reason, every month REDS Ranchi organizes various workshops for parents. These workshops aim at skill development, awareness of the local government's welfare programs, health, nutrition, childcare, and many more.

MEDICAL CAMPS



It is said that "Health is Wealth." Certainly, it is true that good health has a great impact on all the aspects of human life. In the case of students, if they are in good health, they will do well in their studies and other activities. Therefore, REDS organized medical camps due to the poor health of REDS children at twelve different centres at different times. On January 24th and 28th, 2020, REDS Ranchi organized medical camps for the children of the seven centres in Ranchi: Argora, Doranda, Hatma, Hindpiri, Irgutoli, Khadghara, and

Pahari. Around 246 children benefited from these medical camps. These kinds of medical camps are conducted regularly by REDS Ranchi to help the children stay healthy and free from various contagious illnesses due to the seasonal changes.

On February 7, 2020, REDS Ranchi organized a medical camp for the children of the Tokitoli, Bargawa, and Chuta centres. One hundred and forty-one children benefited from this medical camp. Dr. Majoj Kora, and Dr. J.P. Barla were very kind in helping with this medical camp, and they continue to be great supporters for REDS Ranchi by taking care of the children's health.



- **Pre-Natal** - Pre-natal care, also known as *antenatal care*, is a type of preventive healthcare. Its goal is to provide regular check-ups that allow doctors or midwives to treat and prevent potential health problems throughout the course of a pregnancy and to promote healthy lifestyles that benefit both mother and child. A.N.M. nurses provide counseling for pregnant women and gather information regarding the date of conceiving,



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which helps provide nutritional and medical assistance. A.N.M. nurses advise women regarding nutrition, T.T. injections, iron capsules, and the need for regular medical check-ups. A.N.M. nurses monitor and support a mother for their blood pressure and provide the mother with horlicks and vitamins so that they can remain healthy and give birth to a healthy child. Our goal is to reduce the number of malnourished children in the slums.

- **Post-Natal Care** -The care of both mother and child after delivery is very important. In the slums, a mother gives birth to a child with unexperienced mid-wives rather than going to a hospital. The result may be that the mother and child could be



vulnerable. The mothers who are not healthy and not able to feed their children are given horlicks along with gram and jagri to increase blood in their body so that they can recover quickly and begin to care for the newborn. REDS' effort is to reduce the number of mothers' deaths and the lack of blood after delivery. Amul milk is given to children from three months to six months to keep them healthy. The intent is to have a healthy mother and healthy child living a better life.



COUNSELING

The rag pickers' families face many problems within the family itself as well as in society. They are not able to solve the difficulties that arise in their day-to-day lives. At this juncture, we are very helpful. We spend time talking to and listening to them, which instills confidence. While talking, they are able to acknowledge how they can face the difficulties. They come to terms with the difficulties and are able to love and live together. They are also able to limit individual as well as family problems.

INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY COUNSELING

Individual counseling is basically for the students who are school dropouts and alcoholics. Family counseling is very difficult because not all parents have the same disposition. Understanding among parents is not the same for the poorly educated. Often, women understand the need to solve the family difficulties, but the men do not cooperate. Such a lack of cooperation between the parents on how to run the family has a negative impact on the children. They do not get enough love, care, and guidance. The REDS Counselors are helping slum dwellers overcome social and family problems and re-strengthening parenting.

VOLUNTEERS

On Thursdays, Brothers from St. Albert College, Ranchi, visited to the REDS centres. On Mondays, Marianist Sisters come to the centres voluntarily to teach the Non-Formal children. They primarily teach the children rhymes, songs, games, and moral stories. The children are very eager to listen and learn from them. They also visit their homes and talk to their parents in order to motivate them to commit to the education of their children.



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SELF-HELP GROUPS

The REDS Ranchi has twenty-one SHG (Self-Help Groups) and twelve REDS Centers in Ranchi. These groups include ragpickers, coal-pickers, maid servants, mid-wives, and daily working women. These women are not able to save their money; therefore, their lives are miserable. REDS has begun a SHG Program for these women who are living in such poor conditions, to acknowledge their living situation so that they can save their earnings for the future and learn to use their money wisely. Besides saving money, some of them have begun to look for additional incomes such as selling snacks, making pickles, driving autos, and running a poultry farm. These alternative ways to generate income may bring change in their lives and families, and possibly free them from ragpicking and coal-picking. REDS continues to encourage the groups to obtain alternative jobs to save money for a better life education for their children. In order to motivate them, we conduct a meeting with them once in a month.



TEACHERS' DAY

On September 5, 2019, Teachers' Day was grandly celebrated with all the staff on the Gyan Deep campus. Teachers' Day is a special day to appreciate and honor the teachers for their special contribution to the REDS children and their parents. The students of all the centres washed their teacher's hands and offered a rose flower to each of them. All the centre's students prepared welcome songs and dances. The students were all happy and enjoyed presenting gifts to their teachers on the occasion.



REPUBLIC DAY

On January 26, 2020, Republic Day, the national flag was hoisted at all twelve centres. The head of each centre invited the chief guest to hoist the flag in their respective places. At Tokitoli centre, Bro. Sanjay Ekka was the chief guest so he hoisted the flag. The children got inspirational messages from the chief guest and they were enlightened to learn about the country's leaders and the Constitution of India. After the program, sweets were distributed among the children and the parents who attended.



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INDEPENDENCE DAY



On August 15, 2019, the REDS children celebrated the country's 73rd Independence Day in all twelve centres. The chief guest was from the slums. The respected guest speakers hoisted the national flag. The children sang patriotic songs and the National Anthem in their own centres to show their patriotism. Mr. Sandeep Kujur hoisted the National flag at Tokitoli. The head of the centre gave short messages and explained the importance of the color of the national flag. Mr. Sandeep also said a few words about the freedom fighters.

BLANKETS & SWEATERS DISTRIBUTION

REDS distributed blankets and sweaters to the children of all twelve centres during the months of November and December. The blankets and sweaters keep the REDS children warm during the winter season, and they can wear them during their school time and use the blankets at night to protect them from the severe cold, as well as to protect themselves from colds, coughs, and fever. It is nice to see the REDS children's faces smile happily. We are grateful to Accion Marianista for their generous help.



REDS STAFF WORKSHOP

The REDS staff had a workshop on February 1, 2020. It was a day for the staff to come together and share their plans for the coming months as well as a special plan for the summer camps in May. However, the summer camp programme was cancelled due to Covid-19.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Tailoring Unit - Last year, 15 tailoring students were given certificates at the annual celebration of REDS, held on November 24, 2019. At present there are 19 students being trained at the tailoring unit. The main objective of this program is to enhance the quality of life of women and teenage girls by enhancing their skills and knowledge. Due to poverty, these teenage girls often drop out of school, get married, and work as domestics. They needed to learn vocational skills such as tailoring, which can help them earn more income and become economically self-sufficient and independent.



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Computer Department - In the modern world, which is so advanced in technology, obtaining a job that does not require the use of a computer is difficult. In almost all work sectors, the ability to use a computer is absolutely essential. The REDS family is happy to help develop computer skills which will be helpful in finding jobs. There are presently thirty-five students in the computer program, including REDS college students.

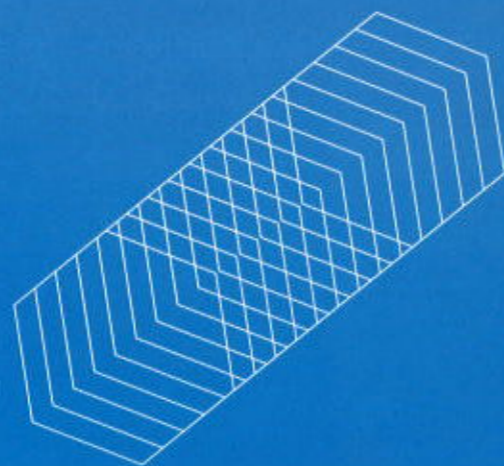


COVID-19 AWARENESS PROGRAMME

My parents are Mr. Roberts Runda and Mrs. Sarah Runda. My mother works as a house servant. My mother earns very little; therefore, it was difficult to continue my studies. In 2006, REDS Ranchi helped me get an admission to 7th class at St. Joseph High School, Samlong. REDS provided me with all the facilities that were needed for my studies. I passed 10th standard in the First Division with a percentage of 67. After that I continued my intermediate studies in St. Xavier College, Ranchi, Jharkhand, which is considered the best college in Jharkhand, and I passed with the percentage of 65. Then I completed my B.A. studies and passed with the percentage of 75. My ambition was to become a nurse. My relatives and friends helped me do staff nurse training in Hyderabad. 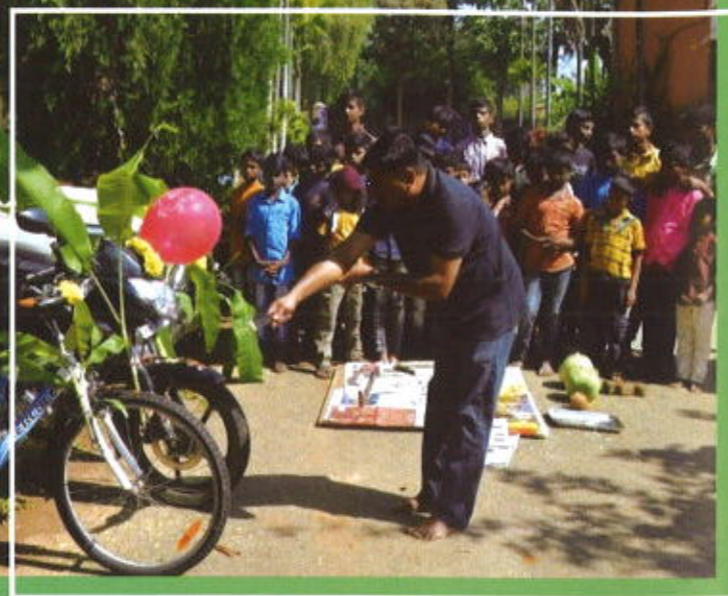
TEACHER'S DAY CELEBRATION

Since October 2012, the Marianists of St. Chaminade Training Institute and Maria Nilaya Community offers hospitality to the ragpicking children, child labourers, domestic help and their siblings on Saturday's at their campus, to initiate and implement REDS Patna activities through the Marianist Trust. These beneficiaries come on their own to recreate, refresh themselves and to get snacks. Members from a few local voluntary associations, youth and students continue to help us to collect and distribute provisions, clothing, stationeries and toys. Eight children are enrolled in formal schools with the cooperation of their guardians. The Marianist Trust sponsors their education and volunteers monitor their studies and do the necessary follow ups for a nominal stipend. Several school dropouts requested help to continue their education while some asked help to learn tailoring and driving skills. REDS is exploring ways to help them through Bihar Board of Open Schooling & Examination and to provide tailoring skills to adults.

The construction of flyovers in Digha-Ghat forced their families to shift their tents and rented rooms while the COVID-19 lockdown, extended summer vacation period, closer of schools, institutions, companies and workplaces have worsened their day-to-day struggle to survive. But the children adjusted themselves to live with their limited resources, besides abandoning their usual neighbourhoods and habits due to this, their family debt got increased. Many survived by the ready help of the local money lenders and occasional help from relatives, friends, charitable institutions and corporal sectors. This unexpected scenario also reduced the old contacts of REDS and many new beneficiaries from the neighbourhood have entered in our campus.



SOME HIGHLIGHTS OF REDS PATNA

- The Marianist Trust continues to provide financial helps to provide medicines, hygiene, recreational activities, food and provisions to the beneficiaries and the needy. The trust encourages the staff to be sensitive to the sufferings and misery of others, to cultivate a special love for the poor and to share their talents and resources to build just and fraternal society.
- Chaminade Training Institutes trainees and staff worked with the children to celebrate festivals and other national events. They decorated the campus and distributed sweets. These activities helped to display their skills & talents and to build healthy relationship.
- Patna Women's College Students and their guides extend their help periodically. Their absence created an emptiness among the children who counted on their smiles, singing, creative teaching and kind encouragement. Come soon, dear volunteers!
- Children who are showing symptoms of cold and cough were asked to remain at home and snacks were sent to them through their friends and neighbours. These awareness programmes have resulted in increasing the usage of face masks in public places.

FUTURE PLAN

- to extend the snack-distribution daily on the Maria Nilaya Campus, and to provide food & provisions to the needy families until the lockdown is lifted and schools gets reopened.
- to continue to create awareness on personal hygiene and hand-washing.
- to promote healthy recreational activities through board games, playing skipping, singing and dancing that would help them to relax.
- to recruit and train female-student-volunteers to teach the illiterate girls and working ladies through stipend and incentive program to teach and learn actively.
- to provide tuitions to the specific school dropouts who are interested to continue their studies and learn employable skills with the collaboration of their parents and guardians.
- to continue and to deepen the networking with the educational institutions to get their support for a holistic development of REDS beneficiaries.
- to maintain case-history files to understand the families of the beneficiaries, to prevent potential school dropouts, to monitor their progress and to plan for their future with them.

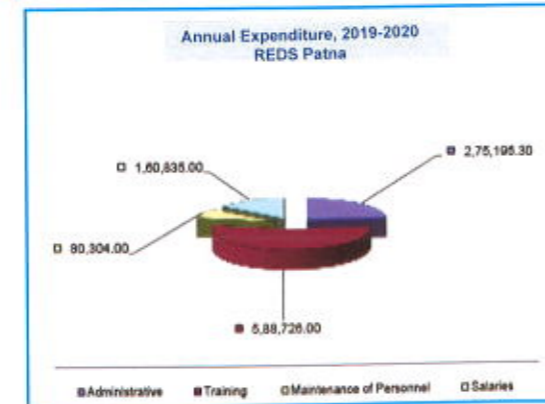
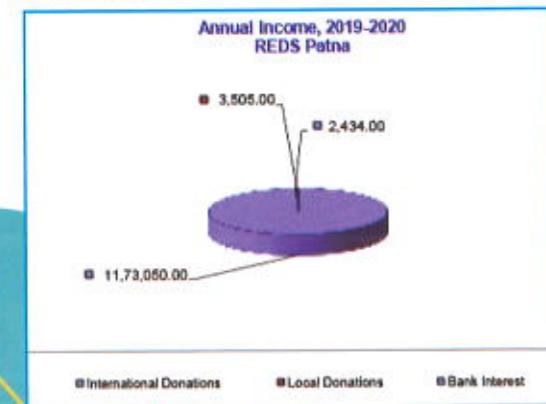
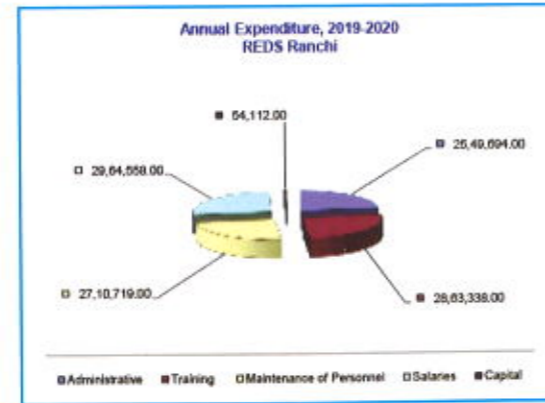
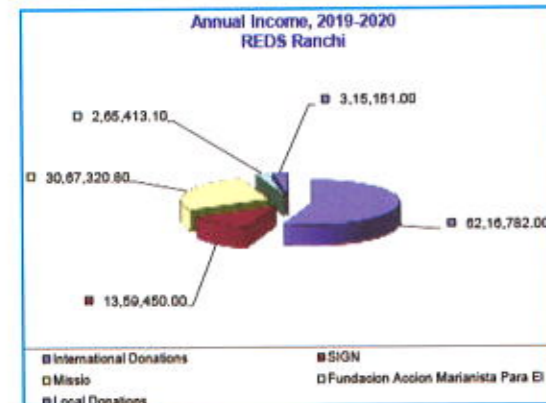
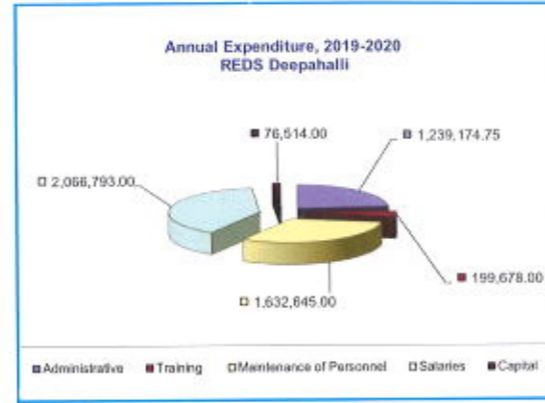
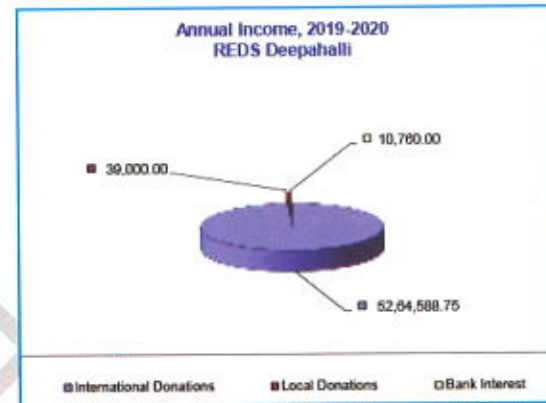
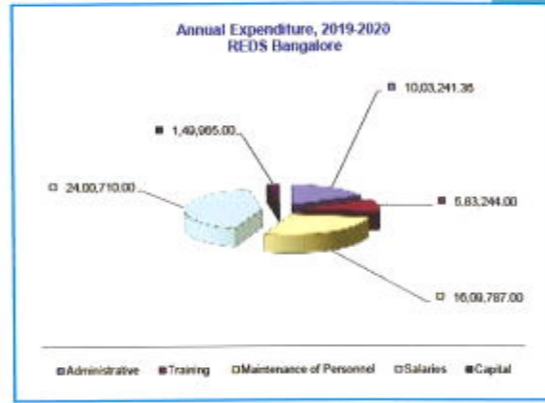
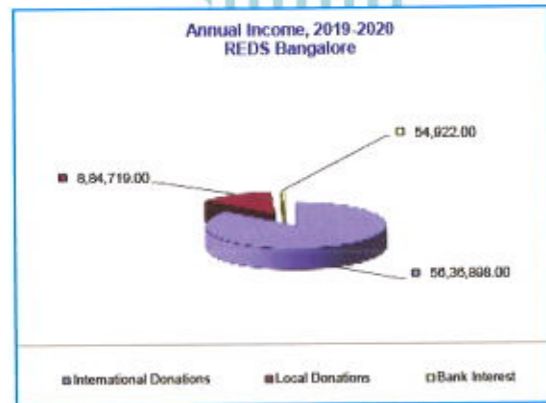
