#### From the Executive Directors Office

Dear Friends and well wishers of REDS,

As I look back with gratitude, I admit that your kind sharing has made a great difference in our beneficiaries, who come from a 'hand to mouth' family environment. Educating the illiterate: Today, the illiterate guardians, relatives and parents are convinced to educate their children, who used to obtain extra cash to the family by 'hook or crook' in an

unhealthy risky environment. What a significant paradigm shift the REDS staff team had created! Initially, the beneficiaries had expressed their inability to create a better future for their siblings and their offspring due to the limited earning from the unsecured and underpaid odd jobs elsewhere. All shared to clear the family debts and realized the importance of additional income to survive. They blamed their destiny and the past generation for their misery. They were convinced of the practicality to survive using their hands. They admitted their ignorance of the procedures to complete the administrational requirements. They were occupied and often on the move. Due to this, their children weren't registered even to utilize the government benefits.





REDS staff assisted in their needs and had obtained their cooperation to create an educational environment in the family. By this, REDS has produced several literate of first-generations. Many children have completed their secondary and higher secondary education and a few are in the process of completing their Degree. Several beneficiaries are earning a better salary and their living standard has improved. They have utilized their professional skills to leap forward and are shining! When REDS was initiated in Bengaluru, REDS gave loan to rent-rooms and houses in Vivek Nagar area and introduced them to different business establishments and the residential areas to collect dry and wet wastes.

ID cards were issued to the regular street contacts to protect them from misunderstanding and to prevent unnecessary harassments. They had repaid the loans through daily savings. Some of them have obtained their own residence from the government schemes and by the help of kind benefactors. REDS walked with them to monitor their progress, to motivate, to assist in their needs and joined them in their gatherings. They became like an extended family, to be counted on. Many of them turned out to be responsible citizens in the social life, gentle fathers and caring mothers. I would like to highlight a few developmental histories.









• Saranya Palani will be completing her degree. The credit

is to the guardians, her mother and grandma. REDS initiated and the family cooperated. This academic year Saranaya will be the first degree holder in the family. Her two elder brothers discontinued their studies and are working. Her two younger

brothers continue their studies. Christina Joyce and her cousins continue their higher studies. Yesupaulraj stayed in REDS STC for four years from 2001 to 2005. Even after completing the vocational training, he continues to relate with REDS staff. Now he is standing on his feet and assists REDS . Recently he took contract for building maintenance and employed others. Vijay and his younger brother Vijay Kumar were residing in REDS-STC for eight years. After being educated they did their apprentices. The staff taught them skills and values. Vijay is looking after his mother, and helped his sister to get married. Vijay Kumar continues his higher studies. Nicky Toppo and his sister were followed by the street educators of the REDS Ranchi based on the initial survey of 1995. Nicky and his friends were regular visitors to the Toki-Toli contact center. After the initial preparation, they were admitted to formal education. After completing his formal school he is



working in REDS Ranchi as a driver. Ms Ruby is completing her Degree through distance education and is teaching in REDS Ranchi. Ranjan volunteers and assist in REDS computer literacy programs in Ranchi.

The aim of REDS, to bring the disadvantaged to the main-stream, is being achieved. Saint Mother Teresa of Kolkata reminded to all those who work for the welfare of the deserving, to do the best faithfully, leaving God to do the rest. Shri Krishna teaches to focus on the duty at hand, without thinking of the result. Lord Jesus Christ tells in the parable of the talents to be faithful and to multiply the little we have got.

Your kind sacrifice and continuous generosity supports REDS to serve these needy brothers and sisters to experience dignity. REDS continues to count on your kind support to uplift the downtrodden because 'what can be done together, none can do alone!' "All of us are called to keep striving towards something greater than ourselves and our families, and every family must feel this constant impulse. Let us make this journey as families, let us keep walking together." - Pope Francis.

Ragpickers Education & Development Scheme (REDS) is working for the socio-economic development of ragpickers, coal-pickers, domestic-helpers, child-labourers, neglected children of daily labourers and migrated families (of Schedule Cast and Schedule Tribe) in Bengaluru (Karnataka), Ranchi (Jharkhand), Hosur (Tamil-Nadu) and Patna (Bihar), who are in need of help to sustain and would like to use the available resources properly by collaborating actively for their prosperity. REDS's programs -street contacts, medical aid, literacy, recreational activities, formal education, vocational skill training, computer literacy, family visits, sensitization, income generation and financial assistance through self-help groups- had been

formulated to eliminate ignorance, to prevent victimization and to promote holistic development for the needy children and their families in urban and rural areas. Seasonal and motivational camps are organized, by networking with expertise and professionals to emphasize the educational development of girl-children, to create self-employment opportunities, to promote healthy motherhood and to educate on civic responsibility. The field-staff and the street-educators identify the beneficiaries, initiate a working relationship, discuss with the children's guardians and refer them to the REDS-contact centers. The centers-in-charge and the professionals analyze their needs and respond favourably through the concerned authorities. The illiterate and the school drop-outs are tutored and assisted to enroll at the nearby formal schools. Their entire educational needs like school fee, uniform, text-books and stationeries are provided. To monitor their academic-progress continuously, these students are





invited to the centers after the school-hours, for extra coaching and for nutrition.

REDS-staff maintain a working-relationship with the school authorities and continue to organize motivational camps for the beneficiaries and their guardians. A few of the former beneficiaries have joined the staff-team. Some of them assist during special programs and others introduce REDS to their friends and to the needy.

How REDS began: REDS activities were initiated by an Inter-religious Dialogue Group and the Catholic Workers Movement in April 1979, as they had seen the sufferings of the migrated poor and their exploitation. This noble mission got a new shape in 1984 through the support of BMSSS- Bangalore Multi-purpose Social Service Society. With the support of local and inter-national agencies, a shelter was built at the Sacred Heart Church campus for these poor children. Volunteers and well-wishers from the neighbourhoods, pious associations, social clubs, institutions and companies donated food and clothing

to observe their family anniversaries and to celebrate seasonal festivals at the shelter. Some institutions had taken these children to their homes to celebrate with them. Youth groups and college students and trainees shared their skills, values and taught them literacy. How did the Marianist-Trust become involved in REDS: During the initial formation period, the Marianists receive multiple trainings, to serve the rural and urban poor, exposed to assisting the sick, the physically challenged, the destitute and the socially marginalized. In line with the Marianist heritage, the seasoned educationists, professionals and social workers help the Marianists to practice cardinal virtues and to eliminate ignorance, vices and prejudices.





In 1988, the pioneering Marianists- scholastics and the aspirants in Bengaluru used to visit the ragpickers- contact centre as a part of their educational activities. The following year they had socialized and entertained these underprivileged-children at the Marianists' residence. That hospitality evening enlightened the Marianists to get associated with REDS.

Since then, we gladly share our resources with them. REDS office, REDS - Skill training programs- and the contact centers are located within the Marianist campus! Participants visit us cheerfully with their siblings, friends and relatives and with pets! From 1992 onwards, the Marianist Trust supports and sponsors all the activities of REDS. In 1995, the Marianists-novices had initiated the survey in Ranchi to work for the welfare of the ragpickers. In July 1996, the Marianists sponsored for the observation survey officially, with the permission from the Ranchi archdiocese. The report was submitted to the Chapter 1996 and REDS Ranchi was inaugurated in 1997 and

and REDS Ranchi was inaugurated in 1997 and REDS Skill Training Center (STC) was initiated in Deepahalli Bengaluru in 1998. Earlier, the Patna Archdiocese invited the Marianists in Digha-Ghat, Patna, to study the plight of the Musahar ragpickers of the Maha-dalit communities and to consider the possibilities of extending the services of REDS Ranchi, among the other outreach programs. From October 2012, the Marianists in Patna continue to maintain a regular contact with the ragpicking children and their families to initiate REDS-Patna. The ragpickers and their friends come to the Marianists' residence on Saturdays' for recreational activities and for refreshments. The neighbours have joined hands to help these friendly visitors.

In 2004, the Marianists and the REDS-Bengaluru staff were asked to initiate a survey in Housr, the bordering city of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, to extend REDS program which would prevent migration. Based on the results, the Marianist Trust





permitted opening two play schools and two tailoring units in Parvathi Nagar and Ram Nagar, Hosur. There are four teachers and two support staff to run the programs. At present there are 75 children in two play schools and 65 trainees in the two tailoring units. The local councillors and the neighbours continue to support to these programs. The REDS-STC (Skill Training Center) provides residential training programs for boys in carpentry, welding, tailoring, computer, plumbing and basic-electrical course besides educating them on mental health, healthy recreational activities, sports & games, personal hygiene, social-life skills, communication skills and value education. The eligible trainees appear for the SSLC exams. The primary school aged children are enrolled in the nearby formal school. REDS Ranchi had introduced traditional knitting, creative embroidery and marketable soft-skill training. Different income generation activities are introduced to the trainees and to their families. They participate actively for their prosperity. The well experienced

REDS staff team and the support staff compassionately provide multiple opportunities to the underprivileged to live a dignified life through the kind resources of the Marianist Trust, benefactors, friends, institutions, agencies, companies, well wishers, associations and enthusiastic-volunteers from all walks of life!

REDS also trains youth to create awareness among the public. REDS gladly welcomes the like minded to create a bright future for the disadvantaged. If you are willing, please contact the nearby office, thank you!







#### **REDS Bengaluru**

REDS activities were initiated by an Inter-religious Dialogue Group and the Catholic Workers Movement in April 1979, as they had seen the sufferings of the migrated poor and their exploitation. This noble mission got a new shape in 1984 through the support of BMSSS- Bangalore Multi-purpose Social Service Society. With the support of local and inter-national agencies, a shelter was built at the Sacred Heart Church campus for these poor children. Volunteers and well-wishers from the neighbourhoods, pious associations, social clubs, institutions and companies donated food and

clothing to observe their family anniversaries and to celebrate seasonal festivals at the shelter. Some institutions had taken these children to their homes to celebrate with them. Youth groups and college students and trainees shared their skills, values and taught them literacy. In its 37 years of existence REDS Bengaluru went through different phases of development and streamlining. The initial welfare method, over the years, gave way to development approach which eventually led to the empowerment of those we work with. Our understanding of the conditions in which the children live and the circumstances that led to the choices they make has caused us to expand our boundaries both geographically and socially so as to extend our support to children other thank involved in waste recycling. Now REDS has play schools,





Day Care Centers, Tuitions Centers, Computer Centers, Tailoring Units, Self-help Groups and solid waste management to support the greater public.

#### **Play schools**

Play schools were initiated to support working mothers. These women left the youngest with older children, which prevented those attending schools. Now REDS Bengaluru has 14 Play schools in different locations of Bengaluru and Hosur. There are 516 children admitted in all the play schools. The staff maintains the attendance, syllabus, students profile and conduct tests. Daily nutrition is provided to these children. Annual medical check-up for all offered freely by the professional trainees. They also visit the families to know the progress of the children and to introduce

REDS programs. Periodical parents' meetings are held at the respective centers. At the end of the academic year certificates are issued to join the regular schools nearby. The table is attached as per the class-attendance.

#### Day Care Center

REDS Bengaluru is running four Day Care Centers in three dissimilar places. These beneficiaries are ragpickers, domestic servants and child-laborers. Seventy nine of these working children regularly visit for recreational activities, literacy, medical aid, value-education and nutrition. The deserving children are promoted to REDS-STC Deepahalli.



#### **Tuition Centers**

REDS Bengaluru has five Tuition Centers in Bengaluru. There are 165 school going students enrolled in these centers to get progress in their studies. Experienced staff assists these students to complete their school home works. Frequent tests are conducted to encourage the students to focus on studies.

#### Tailoring Units

REDS Bengaluru has three tailoring units in Bengaluru, two in Hosur. There are 150 women attending in this vocational skill training course. Some of them are students and many are dropouts and home-makers. As per the current syllabus, the professionals staff train them effectively. There are two batches per day. The program is held for 12 months: April to March. After the successful completion of the training, a Graduation Day is observed to distribute certificates and gifts are distributed to the best students.

REDS Bengaluru conducts a computer literacy program in L R Nagar. Eleven individual computer systems are available with current applications. The syllabus includes Tally ERP and the internet skills. It is open to all. But the majority of them are students of nearby schools and colleges. There are two-batches held every day. This is a short-term course held for a period of three-months only. After the successful completion of the course, certificates are distributed.





#### Self Help Group

REDS Bengaluru has 15 SHG. There are 110 members assisted by a coordinator who monitors all the activities like financial transactions, book-keeping and organizing meetings. They had celebrated Women's Day. Ms Jaquline Jayapaul and Sr Teresa, AMI lead the gatherings. They highlighted on women's rights, the educational development of women and to save the



girl-children. The SHG had organized sports activities and fellowship meal. All the members received a memorandum.

#### **REDS** Ranchi

#### **REDS STC Deepahalli**

The REDS STC (Skill Training Center) provides residential training programs for boys in carpentry, welding, tailoring, traditional knitting, creative embroidery and marketable soft-skill training, computer, plumbing and basic electrical course besides educating them on mental health, healthy recreational activities, sports & games, personal hygiene, social life skills, communication skills and value education. The eligible trainees appear for the SSLC exams. The primary school aged children are enrolled in the nearby formal school. Different income generation activities are introduced to the trainees. Their active participation helps to increase their knowledge and to develop their practical skills.







Sixty boys were present during this academic year; 12 of them are studying at the nearby Govt School and the rest of them were enrolled in the training units; a few discontinued. This year also the neighbours, religious communities, and institutes volunteered to teach, to entertain and to participate in different celebrations. The Marianists, scholastics and aspirants, teaching-staff, supporting staff, the UD professors, friends and well wishers, continue to relate and cheer them.

#### "...coming together is the beginning" – Henry Ford

To respond to the invitation of the Archdiocese of Patna, the Marianists in Digha-Ghat, were asked to initiate an observation survey to identify the prevalence of ragpickers. Dr. (Bro.) Edward Violett, SM., the then Chief Functionary of the Marianist Trust, had lead the team, that was assisted by Brothers S. Victor Sahayaraj SM., and Nesam Anthony, SM. The team had submitted its report to the concerned, emphasized the facts and plights of the underprivi-

leged children and families of the migrated Mushahar of the Mahadalit communities and suggested to expand the REDS Ranchi's developmental activities. In September 2012, Bro. Augustus Surin, SM , now the Chief Functionary of the Marianist Trust, asked the Marianists in Maria Nilaya, Patna, to maintain regular contacts with the ragpickers in view of establishing REDS Patna in the future and continues to provide necessary assistance, since then for the purpose. The nearby ragpickers and their friends who live in Digha-Ghat, Nagarpar and Ramjichak areas come to the Marianist residence particularly on Saturdays for recreational activities,





refreshments and other emergency needs. The ragpickers in the other areas -Patliputra Station Road, Rajeev Nagar, Beliroad, Digha- Ashiana Road and Rajapool-Danapur Road-, are being observed to continue properly. The neighbours, youth, friends and a few members from pious associations, continue to help these visitors kindly; some had collected clothes and others provided snacks. The alumni and alumnae from the Chaminade Training Institute assisted on Saturdays; some helped to survey the area, a few took literacy and tuition classes, assisted in the campus maintenance, prepared snacks, entertained the children, decorated, sponsored for specific activities and programs; a few exited and acted like Public Relations Officers; they introduced these simple initiatives to their families, relatives and friends to share their joy. (May God reward them!) Most Rev. William D'Souza, SJ., the Archbishop of Patna and the team, Rev. Fr. Amalraj, the Director of Sewa Kendra, Kurji, the CJ Sisters (Sister Lidiya, and the novitiate community), the Jesuits Communities in Patna supported kindly and continue to encourage.





#### **Future Plan:**

1. REDS Patna Office will be opened at the Maria Nilaya Campus, (Marianists residence) XTTI Road, Digha-Ghat), which will function as Contact Center and for documenting.

2. The Marianists in Maria Nilaya, street educators and the field-activists will continue the contact with the migrant ragpickers in Digha-Ghat and the surrounding areas, to assist the migrated child teen ragpickers and their families for their ongoing socio economical and educational development through these activities;








